HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A REGIONAL CESSPOOL MODERNIZATION TASK FORCE WITHIN EACH COUNTY OF THE STATE.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, Act 125, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, among other provisions, required the Department of Health to investigate and report to the Legislature on:
5 6	(1) The number, scope, and location of cesspools statewide that require:
7 8 9	(A) An upgrade or conversion to a septic system or aerobic treatment unit system; or
10 11 12	(B) Connection to a sewerage system; and
12 13 14	(2) The priority of upgrading, converting, or connecting cesspools; and
15 16 17	WHEREAS, in December 2017, the Department of Health submitted its report to the Legislature; and
18 19 20	WHEREAS, the Department of Health's report, among other findings:
21 22 23 24 25 26	(1) Noted that Hawaii has eighty-seven thousand nine hundred inventoried cesspools, which put an aggregate total of approximately fifty-three million gallons of raw sewage into the State's groundwater and surface waters every day;
27 28 29 30	(2) Estimated that the cost of upgrading, converting, or connecting each inventoried cesspool in the State could cost approximately \$20,000 or more per cesspool,



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or \$1,750,000,000 in the aggregate, with an average 1 construction investment of \$54,700,000 per year from 2 2018 to 2049; and 3 4 Identified fourteen areas within the State, containing (3) 5 an aggregate total of 42,730 cesspools, as priority 6 7 areas for upgrading, converting, or connecting 8 cesspools; and 9 WHEREAS, in its report, the Department of Health noted that 10 issues relating to cesspools are complex and involve access to 11 municipal sewer systems, local geology, cesspool density, 12 receiving waters, and most-appropriate treatment technology; 13 now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 16 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 17 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Health is 18 requested to convene a regional cesspool modernization task 19 force within each county of the State for the purpose of 20 investigating the feasibility and potential impacts of the 21 department's findings and recommendations in its December 2017 22 report to the Legislature on cesspool replacement in light of 23 health, safety, geographic, and economic considerations; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, at a minimum, the following 26 individuals are requested to serve and be included as members of 27 the regional cesspool modernization task force within each 28 29 county: 30 One representative of the Department of Health who 31 (1)resides in the respective county, as appointed by the 32 Director of Health; 33 34 One senator from the State Senate who resides in the 35 (2) respective county, as appointed by the President of 36 the Senate; 37 38 (3) One representative from the State House of 39 Representatives who resides in the respective county, 40 as appointed by the Speaker of the House of 41 42 Representatives;

5 6 7 8	(5)	One representative of the respective county's economic development department or office, as appointed by the head of that department or office;

19 20 21 22	(8)	One member of the community, as jointly appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and
