HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE STATUS OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION IN HAWAII'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, research suggests that schools that provide time for high-quality physical education generate a positive effect on academic achievement and some of the benefits include increased concentration; improved scores in mathematics, reading, and writing; and a reduction in disruptive behaviors; and

8 WHEREAS, physical education offered within public schools 9 can provide all students access to physical activity regardless 10 of race; ethnicity; socioeconomic status; gender; or urban, 11 suburban, or rural setting; and

13 WHEREAS, physical education programs are critical to 14 providing students with the skills necessary to achieve and 15 maintain life-long physical fitness; and

WHEREAS, regular physical activity and physical fitness can
play a significant role in promoting health and preventing
chronic illnesses such as heart disease, cancer, type 2
diabetes, and osteoporosis; and

22 WHEREAS, in 2013, the Institute of Medicine identified 23 daily school physical education for all students as a strategy 24 to prevent obesity across the nation; and 25

WHEREAS, SHAPE America, the American Heart Association, and a number of other national health organizations recommend that schools provide one hundred fifty minutes per week of instructional physical education for elementary school children and two hundred twenty-five minutes per week for middle and high school students throughout the school year; and

WHEREAS, the Hawaii Content and Performance Standards III 1 for physical education were based on national standards in 2005, 2 3 but have not been updated since then and do not align with the 4 National Physical Education Standards developed in 2013; and 5 WHEREAS, barriers and challenges have impeded the 6 Department of Education from fully implementing the Hawaii 7 Content and Performance Standards III for physical education in 8 9 all grades; now, therefore, 10 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 12 13 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Education is requested to provide a report to the Legislature on the 14 status of physical education in Hawaii's public schools; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the status report include but 17 18 not be limited to: 19 The current state of physical education in Hawaii's 20 (1) public schools, including the number of physical 21 education instructional minutes per week provided to 22 all students in grades K-12, gualifications of 23 personnel delivering physical education, and methods 24 for assessment of student achievement on instructional 25 standards for physical education; and 26 27 (2) A plan for adoption of current national 28 recommendations, including an estimate of needs and 29 resources to implement updated instructional 30 standards, increased minutes of instruction, 31 professional development, assessments, and sequential 32 standards-based curriculum; and 33 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to submit a report of its findings and 36 37 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 38 the Regular Session of 2019; and 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 41 42 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
