

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE STATE OF HAWAI'I TO REVIEW AND UPDATE ITS TELECOMMUNICATION DEVICES AND ACCESS FOR THE DEAF, INDIVIDUALS WITH HEARING DISABILITIES, AND INDIVIDUALS WITH SPEECH DISABILITIES.

WHEREAS, individuals who are deaf or who have a hearing or 1 speech disability must often utilize technology and technology-2 3 based services and equipment to effectively communicate with others; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, telecommunications relay services are telephone 7 transmission services that provide an individual who has a hearing or speech disability with the ability to engage in 8 communication by wire or radio with a hearing individual in a 9 manner that is functionally equivalent to the ability of an 10 individual who does not have a hearing or speech disability to 11 communicate using wire or radio voice communication services; 12 and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, telecommunications relay services have traditionally meant text-to-voice teletypewriter (TTY)-based 16 services; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, new internet-based technology is now readily available; and 20 21 WHEREAS, many text-to-voice teletypewriter users have 22 switched to other means of communication; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the position of the National Association of the 25 Deaf is that it is imperative to periodically update laws and 26 regulations to incorporate new and emerging telecommunications 27 28 equipment and services to ensure continued accessibility and 29 usability; and

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WHEREAS, according to data from the United States Census 1 Bureau and the National Center for Health Statistics, there are 2 approximately one hundred ten thousand residents in the State 3 4 who are deaf or have a hearing or speech disability; and 5 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission has a 6 responsibility to implement intrastate telecommunications relay 7 services for individuals who are deaf or have a hearing or 8 speech disability; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the State has established the Office of Enterprise 11 Technology Services headed by the Chief Information Officer who 12 is charged with organizing, managing, and overseeing information 13 technology governance in the State; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Disability and Communication Access Board 16 serves as a public advocate for persons with disabilities by 17 providing advice and recommendations with regard to legislation, 18 rules, policies, procedures, and plans relating to persons with 19 disabilities and their civil rights or service needs; now, 20 therefore. 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 24 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Office of Enterprise 25 Technology Services, in consultation with the Public Utilities 26 Commission and the Disability and Communication Access Board, is 27 requested to review existing and emerging telecommunications 28 equipment, services, and polices to ensure continued 29 accessibility and usability for individuals who are deaf or who 30 have a hearing or speech disability, and identify any areas 31 where accessibility and usability can be improved; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, in consultation with the Public Utilities 35 Commission and the Disability and Communication Access Board, is 36 37 requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 38 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 39 the Regular Session of 2019; and 40
