HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

RECOGNIZING THE THIRTY-DAY PERIOD FROM THE LAST SATURDAY IN SEPTEMBER TO THE LAST SUNDAY IN OCTOBER AS MALAMA PU'ULOA MONTH.

1	WHEREAS, based on radiocarbon dating, also known as Carbon-
2	14 dating, the oldest settlement on Oahu is in present-day West
3	Loch area; and
4	
5	WHEREAS, the Nanaulu family, one of the first settlers in
6	Hawaii from Tahiti, settled in an area originally known as
7	Keawalauopu'uloa, or "the many harbors of Pu'uloa," in 400 A.D.;
8 9	and
9 10	WHEREAS, many areas in Pu'uloa in the greater 'Ewa region
10	are important sites in Hawaiian history; and
11	are important sites in nawarian history, and
13	WHEREAS, Pu'uloa in 'Ewa was the only moku in which all
14	rivers in the twelve ahupua'a flowed to one place; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, 'Ewa was the center of government during ancient
17	times and was the location of ancient political capitals,
18	including Lihue, Waikele, Lepau, and Pu'uloa; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, many important historical figures were from 'Ewa
21	and Pu'uloa, such as Kalaniopu'u, who was the grandfather of
22	Kamehemeha, and Kalaimanuia, who served as the second female moi
23	chiefess of the island of Oahu; and
24	
25	WHEREAS, current residents in 'Ewa are planning service
26	activities and community gatherings, including events in
27	Kapapapuhi Point Park, with the purpose of restoring Pu'uloa back
28	to its original state; now, therefore,



BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, the Senate concurring, that this body recognizes the thirty-day period from the last Saturday in September to the last Sunday in October as "Malama Pu'uloa Month" and celebrates one of the first settlement sites on Oahu; and
