HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING AN INCREASED HONOLULU POLICE DEPARTMENT PRESENCE ON OAHU'S NORTH SHORE.

1 WHEREAS, Oahu's North Shore is one of the State's most 2 scenic areas and features world-famous beaches, majestic ocean 3 waves, unique restaurants and retail businesses, and a quiet and 4 respectful community; and 5

6 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau
7 estimates that more than half of Oahu's 6,500,000 visitors make
8 the trek to the North Shore at some time during their stay on
9 Oahu; and

11 WHEREAS, it is important to maintain the safety of North 12 Shore residents, business owners, workers, and patrons as well 13 as to protect their property and possessions and preserve the 14 community-based lifestyle of Oahu's North Shore; and

16 WHEREAS, residents have reported that crimes such as arson, 17 vandalism, theft, and burglary have sharply increased in the 18 community, making residents feel unsafe and dissuading visitors 19 from visiting the North Shore; and

21 WHEREAS, on December 7, 2017, tourists found the body of an 22 elementary school teacher who had been cleaning a rental home on 23 Ke Iki Road near Sunset Beach and five days later a man and a 24 woman were charged with murder, kidnapping, and burglary in 25 connection with her death; and

WHEREAS, according to the latest Honolulu Police Department
(HPD) annual reports from 2015 and 2016, there was an increase
in the total index crime rate that consists of murder, rape,
robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny, and auto theft

reports in Wahiawa's District 2, which includes the North Shore; 1 2 and 3 WHEREAS, the total index crime rate reported for District 2 4 5 increased from 2,023 to 2,055 crimes per 100,000 residents in 2015 and 2016, respectively, according to data extrapolated by 6 the Attorney General's Research and Statistics Division; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, in District 2 from 2015 to 2016, reports of burglary increased from 320 to 359 and auto theft reports 10 11 increased from 284 to 324; and 12 WHEREAS, North Shore residents have reported an increase in 13 crime, particularly car break-ins, during the final months of 14 2017; and 15 16 WHEREAS, according an HPD report encompassing January 2018, 17 there were 304 reported crimes, including 65 reports of theft, 18 19 96 reports of unauthorized entry into motor vehicles, and 23 reports of burglary in District 2; and 20 21 WHEREAS, according to HPD, there were 33 reported incidents 22 relating to burglary, motor vehicle theft, theft, and 23 24 unauthorized entry into a motor vehicle from January 29, 2018, through February 11, 2018, in Sector 3 of District 2, identified 25 as the areas of Waialua and the North Shore; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, while the number of reported incidents within a short period of time is already a concern, total incidence of 29 30 crime on the North Shore may be even higher as many crimes may not be reported to HPD; and 31 32 WHEREAS, members of the North Shore community and area 33 business owners are calling for more police presence in the 34 area, due to concerns about the recent increase in incidence and 35 severity of criminal activity; and 36 37 WHEREAS, the North Shore is similar to Waikiki as both 38 districts are frequented by many visitors and have high 39 incidences of property crime; and 40 41 WHEREAS, while police have increased patrols and added 42 newly graduated officers to the Waikiki district after a string 43 of crimes in the area in late 2017, a similar HPD enforcement 44

1 strategy should be implemented on the North Shore to decrease 2 property crime and offenses against visitors and residents; and 3 4 WHEREAS, increasing the visible presence of uniformed 5 police officers improves public safety by deterring criminal activity as well as providing more immediate assistance to 6 7 victims once a crime has been committed; now, therefore, 8 9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 10 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Mayor of the City and 11 County of Honolulu and the Honolulu City Council are strongly 12 urged to allocate more resources to the Honolulu Police 13 Department, for the purpose of increasing visible police . 14 presence in, and active patrols of, the North Shore of Oahu; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City 18 and County of Honolulu, the Chair of the Honolulu City Council, 19 20 the Chief of the Honolulu Police Department, and the Chair of the North Shore Neighborhood Board. 21
