HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS BOTH THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF PROPOSED MANDATED HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE COSTS OF MEDICALLY NECESSARY TRANSPORTATION TO THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES FOR QUALIFYING PATIENTS.

| 1 2 3 | WHEREAS, critically ill patients in Hawaii may require treatment on the continental United States; and |
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| 5 4 5 6 | WHEREAS, commercial flights are not an option for these patients because each patient requires life-supporting equipment and a medical support team; and |
| 7 8 9 10 | WHEREAS, the cost of transportation by an air ambulance can be a significant financial burden that may not be covered by insurance; and |
| 11 12 13 14 15 | WHEREAS, although Medicaid currently covers the cost of transportation to the continental United States for Hawaii's most needy families, those who are middle-income earners and working full-time do not receive comparable coverage; and |
| 16 17 18 19 | WHEREAS, for many patients requiring transportation to the continental United States, their only options are to mortgage their homes, drain retirement savings, borrow from family or |
| 20 21 22 23 24 | friends, or establish an online campaign to raise funds; and WHEREAS, during the time that a family is fundraising for a sick loved one, the patient's condition may rapidly deteriorate and reduce the chance of recovery; and |
| 25 26 27 28 29 | WHEREAS, if a delay in treatment is too long, then the accepting facility on the mainland may give the patient's bed to another individual, and the patient is forced to find another accepting facility; and |



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the Pacific Ocean, the State's residents deserve to receive 2 life-saving medical care that is not available in the State; and 3 4 WHEREAS, H.B. No. 687, H.D. 2, considered during the 5 Regular Session of 2018, proposes to require insurance coverage 6 7 for the costs of medically necessary transportation to the continental United States for qualifying patients; and 8 9. WHEREAS, in testimony submitted to the House of 10 Representatives Standing Committee on Consumer Protection and 11 Commerce regarding H.B. No. 687, H.D. 1, the Hawaii Medical 12 Service Association suggested that the measure be amended by 13 amending the term "qualifying patient" to mean a patient who is, 14 among other qualifying criteria, on medically-necessary 15 extracorporeal membrane oxygenation or mechanical circulatory 16 support (including percutaneous ventricular assist devices and 17 intraaortic balloon pump therapies) in order to qualify for the 18 mandated coverage proposed in the measure; and 19 20 WHEREAS, H.B. No. 687, H.D. 2, does not incorporate the 21 22 foregoing requested amendment; and 23 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 23-51, Hawaii Revised 24 Statutes, before any legislative measure that mandates health 25 insurance coverage for specific health services, specific 26 diseases, or certain providers of health care services as part 27 of individual or group health insurance policies, can be 28 considered, concurrent resolutions shall be passed that 29 designate a specific legislative bill for the Auditor to prepare 30 a report, which is commonly known as a "sunrise review", for 31 submission to the Legislature that assesses both the social and 32 financial effects of the proposed mandated coverage under that 33 legislative bill; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 37 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is requested to 38 assess, pursuant to section 23-51, Hawaii Revised Statutes, both 39 the social and financial effects of the proposed mandated health 40 insurance coverage under H.B. No. 687, H.D. 2, Regular Session 41 of 2018, which requires insurance coverage for the costs of 42 medically necessary transportation to the continental United 43 States for qualifying patients; and 44

WHEREAS, due to Hawaii's unique position in the middle of



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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the course of conducting its 1 assessment, the Auditor is requested to assess the social and 2 financial effects of amending the existing definition of the 3 term "qualifying patient", as it appears in H.B. No. 687, H.D. 4 2, to include a provision that requires a patient be on 5 medically-necessary extracorporeal membrane oxygenation or 6 mechanical circulatory support (including percutaneous 7 ventricular assist devices and intraaortic balloon pump 8 therapies) to qualify for the mandated covered benefit proposed 9 in the measure; and 10

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2019; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Auditor.
