
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO COLLABORATIVELY WORK WITH COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO IDENTIFY AND ESTABLISH OFF-LEASH DOG PARKS IN METROPOLITAN HONOLULU.

1 WHEREAS, according to the American Veterinary Medical
2 Association, the national average for households owning at least
3 one dog is 36.5 percent; however, pet ownership on Oahu is much
4 higher, with at least 60 percent of households owning at least
5 one dog or cat; and

6
7 WHEREAS, Hawaii's dog owners represent over one third of
8 the population and pet owners in Hawaii spend over \$90,000,000 a
9 year on pet-related expenses such as food, supplies,
10 veterinarians, and groomers and make a large contribution to
11 Hawaii's tax base; and

12
13 WHEREAS, in the Honolulu metropolitan area, only 5 off-
14 leash dog parks exist to serve 143,000 dog owners; and

15
16 WHEREAS, dog parks improve the quality of life for dog
17 owners as well as for their dogs, promote a healthy lifestyle
18 for people and pets, add to our sense of community, and help to
19 promote responsible dog ownership; and

20
21 WHEREAS, dogs who do not have outlets for their physical
22 and mental energy may become nuisance barkers, escape artists,
23 or develop other destructive behaviors; and

24
25 WHEREAS, dogs have an inherent need for regular exercise
26 and socialization and the single most important factor in making
27 dogs friendly and well-behaved is frequent interaction with both
28 people and other dogs; and



1 WHEREAS, as leash laws continue to become increasingly
2 restrictive, residents see dog parks as a way to let dogs run
3 free without penalty to pet owners or damage to private
4 property; and
5

6 WHEREAS, off-leash dog parks, whether privately or publicly
7 owned, are maintained by volunteers and require users to pick up
8 after their dogs so that all park users can enjoy a clean and
9 safe environment; and
10

11 WHEREAS, Hui 'Ilio Hawaii has been actively supporting local
12 dog park groups and aiding in the search for suitable places to
13 establish off-leash dog parks in their respective communities;
14 now, therefore,
15

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
17 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
18 of 2018, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and
19 Natural Resources and Department of Parks and Recreation of the
20 City and County of Honolulu are encouraged to collaboratively
21 work with community stakeholders to identify and establish off-
22 leash dog parks within urban areas of metropolitan Honolulu; and

24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
25 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
26 Board of Land and Natural Resources, Director of the Department
27 of Parks and Recreation of the City and County of Honolulu, and
28 the Chairperson of the Advisory Board of Parks and Recreation of
29 the City and County of Honolulu.
