## HOUSE RESOLUTION

---

REQUESTING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY TO ESTABLISH A CAMPAIGN TO EDUCATE VISITORS TO THE STATE ABOUT THE HARMFUL EFFECTS OF OXYBENZONE SUNSCREEN ON CORAL REEFS AND TO ENCOURAGE VISITORS TO THE STATE TO REFRAIN FROM USING OXYBENZONE SUNSCREENS.

1 WHEREAS, the decline of coral reefs poses a significant  
2 ecological threat worldwide; and  
3

4 WHEREAS, while scientists around the world agree that the  
5 primary causes of coral decline are related to global warming,  
6 agricultural runoff, sewage, and overfishing, recent studies  
7 have shown that that oxybenzone, a common sunscreen ingredient,  
8 also has detrimental effects on coral reefs; and

10 WHEREAS, coral larvae deformity, bleaching, and DNA damage  
11 that weaken coral systems' adaptability to climate change have  
12 all been attributed to oxybenzone exposure; and

14 WHEREAS, the harmful effects of oxybenzone are particularly  
15 acute in Hawaiian ocean waters where coral bleaching is  
16 occurring at a historic rate never before noted in recorded  
17 history; and

19 WHEREAS, there are reasonable alternatives to oxybenzone-  
20 based sunscreens, such as zinc oxide and titanium oxide, that  
21 allow beach-users to enjoy the outdoors without compromising sun  
22 protection; now, therefore,

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
25 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
26 of 2018, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to  
27 establish a campaign to educate visitors to the State about the  
28 harmful effects of oxybenzone sunscreen on coral reefs and to  
29 encourage visitors to the State to refrain from using oxybenzone  
30 sunscreens; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is requested to submit a report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2019, on the efforts taken to educate visitors to the State about the harmful effects of oxybenzone sunscreen on coral reefs and to encourage visitors to the State to refrain from using oxybenzone sunscreens; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the President of the Hawaii Tourism Authority.
