## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING CONGRESS TO RECOGNIZE THE INCREASING STATE-LEVEL OPPOSITION TO THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION'S REPEAL OF NET NEUTRALITY AND TO IMMEDIATELY ACT TO RESTORE NET NEUTRALITY REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, in 2015, the Federal Communications Commission 1 adopted net neutrality regulations to protect internet users and 2 ensure all content over the Internet was treated equally and 3 4 without preferential treatment; and 5 6 WHEREAS, however, in 2017, the Federal Communications Commission voted to repeal net neutrality regulations despite 7 heavy opposition by net neutrality supporters who argued the 8 deregulation would allow internet service providers the 9 opportunity to limit or prioritize certain access to information 10 at their discretion; and 11 12 WHEREAS, in February 2018, Hawaii Governor David Ige signed 13 an executive order that required all state agencies to obtain 14 their internet-related services from internet service providers 15 who agree to abide by net neutrality principles; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, Governor Ige has joined governors from Montana, New York, New Jersey, and Vermont in signing executive orders on 19 20 protecting net neutrality principles; and 21 WHEREAS, in March 2018, Washington became the first state 22 to pass a law making it illegal for internet service providers 23 to manipulate their networks for money, while dozens of other 24 25 states are considering similar measures through legislation and lawsuits; and 26 27 WHEREAS, in context of the repeal of net neutrality 28 regulations set to take effect on April 23, 2018, it is in the 29 State's interest to explore the possibility of establishing a 30 state-owned public utility company to provide high-speed 31

broadband internet service, similar to municipalities such as 1 Chattanooga, Tennessee, and Sandy, Oregon, which have had 2 success with public companies providing internet service; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that it is essential to 5 6 ensure that people can access websites and information freely and fairly over the Internet; now, therefore, 7 8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 9 10 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, that Congress is urged to recognize the increasing 11 12 state-level opposition to the Federal Communications 13 Commission's repeal of net neutrality and to immediately act to restore net neutrality regulations; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 16 17 Consumer Affairs is requested to study the costs and benefits to the State to supply high-speed broadband internet service 18 19 through a state-owned public utility company; and 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Commerce and 21 Consumer Affairs is requested to submit a report of findings and 22 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 23 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 24 25 the Regular Session of 2019; and 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 27 Resolution be transmitted to the President Pro Tempore, Majority 28 29 Leader, and Minority Leader of the United States Senate, the 30 Speaker, Majority Leader, and Minority Leader of the United 31 States House of Representatives, Hawaii's Congressional Delegation, Chairperson of the Federal Communications 32 33 Commission, the respective Governors and presiding officers of 34 the legislative bodies of each of the other forty-nine states, the Governor, and the Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. 35 36 37 OFFERED BY: 79 38
