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HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO ENACT LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE UNIVERSAL HEALTH CARE TO ALL INDIVIDUALS RESIDING IN THE UNITED STATES AND THE TERRITORIES OF THE UNITED STATES.

1 WHEREAS, the quality and cost of healthcare affects every 2 resident and citizen of the United States, whether the 3 individual is covered by public or private insurance or is 4 uninsured; and

6 WHEREAS, the health and well-being of Hawaii's residents
7 and families has always been of paramount concern to the
8 Legislature and the people of the State of Hawaii; and

10 WHEREAS, recognizing that access to health care is a 11 fundamental human right, the Legislature of the State of Hawaii 12 enacted the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act in 1974, the first 13 law in the nation to set minimum standards of health care 14 coverage for workers; and

WHEREAS, for over forty years, the Hawaii Prepaid Health 16 Care Act has protected the welfare of the people of Hawaii, 17 offering residents unparalleled access to health care benefits 18 and services through various mandates, such as requiring 19 employers who employ one or more full-time employees to provide 20 health insurance, setting the standards for health care coverage 21 in Hawaii, limiting the amount that employees must contribute to 22 premiums, and requiring employees to accept employer-provided 23 coverage unless covered under another health insurance plan; and 24 25

26 WHEREAS, enactment of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act 27 has resulted in Hawaii having robust health care plans, low 28 uninsured rates, and some of the lowest premiums in the country, 29 and although Hawaii experiences some of the same issues relative 30 to access, quality, and cost of health care as other states



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across the country, the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act has 1 ensured health care system stability throughout the State; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, prior to the enactment of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care Act, the percentage of Hawaii residents maintaining 5 health care insurance coverage hovered in the seventy percent 6 7 range; and 8 WHEREAS, after enactment of the Hawaii Prepaid Health Care 9 Act, the percentage of residents in Hawaii maintaining health 10 care insurance coverage increased to the ninety percent range 11 and has remained in that range ever since, positively impacting 12 the health and well-being of all the residents of Hawaii; and 13 14 15 WHEREAS, attempts have been made over the past two decades 16 to make universal health care a reality for all residents of the United States; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the most significant federal regulatory overhaul 19 20 and expansion of medical care coverage since the establishment of Medicare and Medicaid in 1965 occurred in 2010 with the 21 passage of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, which 22 23 mandates that every citizen of the United States maintain health care insurance coverage through various means, including 24 25 employer health care insurance plans, or face an income tax 26 surcharge; and 27 28 WHEREAS, while passage of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act made insurance available to between 29 32,000,000 and 50,000,000 more Americans, or 95 percent of the 30 legal resident population, and brought the United States closer 31 32 to achieving a system of universal health care, a significant number of individuals in the United States remain uninsured; and 33 34 WHEREAS, H.R. No. 676 has been introduced in the 115^{th} 35 Congress of the United States and establishes the Medicare for 36 37 All Program to provide all individuals residing in the United 38 States and territories of the United States with free health care that includes all medically necessary care, such as primary 39 40 care and prevention, dietary and nutritional therapies,



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prescription drugs, emergency care, long-term care, mental 1 health services, dental services, and vision care; and 2

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WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Hawaii continues 4 5 to believe that the availability of health care for all is a human right, that the United States should strive to achieve a 6 system of universal health care that includes all residents of 7 8 this country, and that H.R. No. 676, introduced in the United 9 States Congress, deserves full consideration and passage; now, therefore, 10

12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 13 of 2018, that the Congress of the United States is urged to 14 15 enact legislation such as H.R. No. 676 that provides universal 16 health care to all; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the President Pro Tempore of the 19 United States Senate, Speaker of the United States House of 20 Representatives, and members of Hawaii's Congressional 21 22 delegation.
