HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU TO CREATE INCLUSIVE PLAYGROUNDS.

1 WHEREAS, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is a 2 civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against 3 individuals with disabilities in all areas of public life, 4 including jobs, schools, transportation, and all public and 5 private places that are open to the general public; and 6

WHEREAS, the purpose of the ADA is to ensure that people 7 8 with disabilities have the same rights and opportunities as everyone else by granting them civil rights protections similar 9 to those protections provided to individuals on the basis of 10 race, color, sex, national origin, age, and religion, and to 11 quarantee equal opportunity for individuals with disabilities in 12 public accommodations, employment, transportation, state and 13 local government services, and telecommunications; and 14 15

16 WHEREAS, play is crucial for human development, the growth 17 of social skills, and self-confidence; and

19 WHEREAS, an accessible playground is one that offers a 20 range of play experiences to children of varying abilities and 21 generally complies with the ADA, but does not mean that each and 22 every feature or event must be usable by every child; and 23

24 WHEREAS, an inclusive playground provides more for people 25 with disabilities than accessible playgrounds by taking away the 26 barriers to inclusion, both physical and social, and providing a 27 "sensory rich" experience for all; and

29 WHEREAS, children without disabilities may also benefit 30 from inclusive playgrounds by connecting with children from 31 different backgrounds and abilities, and gain empathy, social, 32 and emotional skills; and

WHEREAS, inclusive playgrounds provide benefits to more 1 individuals than just children since there are far more parents 2 and grandparents with disabilities than children and cross-3 4 generational play is beneficial for families; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that play experiences at parks should be accessible for all children and their families, 7 8 without regard to physical ability; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu currently lacks inclusive playgrounds; now, therefore, 11 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 14 of 2018, that the City and County of Honolulu is urged to 15 create, at minimum, one inclusive playground accessible to 16 children and caregivers of all physical abilities; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City and County of Honolulu 19 20 is urged to obtain and consider community input before any design or construction takes place; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that inclusive playgrounds should be 23 designed and constructed in accordance with the Americans with 24 Disabilities Act of 1990, P.L. 101-336, the 2010 Americans with 25 Disabilities Act Standards for Accessible Design, and any 26 relevant guidelines issued by the United States Department of 27 Justice, including but not limited to accessibility quidelines 28 on play areas, play surfaces, play components, and access 29 30 routes; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that inclusive playgrounds should be designed and constructed with sufficient and accessible 33 amenities, including parking spaces and bathrooms; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of 37





Honolulu and the Director of the Department of Parks and
Recreation of the City and County of Honolulu.
