HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO OPPOSE THE FEDERAL COMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION'S RECENT DECISION TO OVERTURN THE 2015 NET NEUTRALITY RULES AND TO PASS LEGISLATION THAT WOULD RETAIN NET NEUTRALITY NATIONWIDE.

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Hawaii and the United 1 States use and depend on the internet for personal, academic, 2 professional, and social purposes; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the lack of net neutrality rules prior to 2015 allowed internet service providers to favor certain content or 6 service providers over others without informing their customers 7 of such favoritism; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the net neutrality rules adopted by the Federal 10 Communications Commission in February 2015 ("2015 net neutrality 11 rules") required internet service providers to offer equal 12 access to websites to their customers, regardless of the 13 customer's internet service plan and regardless of payment by 14 commercial websites; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the 2015 net neutrality rules have prevented 17 unequal access to websites because of monetary influence and 18 19 have thus allowed internet users to access the websites of their own choosing without internet service providers' slowing down 20 data from disfavored websites and speeding up data from favored 21 22 ones; and 23 WHEREAS, the proposed new rules of the Federal 24 Communications Commission would harm: 25 26 Internet entrepreneurs, who could be forced to pay (1)27 fees for faster delivery of their content; and 28 29 (2) Internet users, because the new rules would create 30 incentives for internet service providers to block and 31

throttle websites in order to obtain extra fees from 1 consumers or content providers; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the ability of internet service providers to 4 control users' access to online content results in the undue and 5 unjust influence of powerful economic forces and undermines 6 individuals' ability to freely access information or 7 8 communicate; and 9 WHEREAS, the ability of internet service providers to 10 control users' access to online content would effectively 11 transform internet service providers into information 12 gatekeepers who could place profits over consumer interests 13 while also controlling what internet users can view and express 14 15 online; and 16 WHEREAS, the internet has become a public utility, similar 17 18 to power and water, and every user has the right to access 19 online content without interference or manipulation by an internet service provider; and 20 21 WHEREAS, various states, including New York, Montana, 22 23 California, Rhode Island, Nebraska, Washington, and Massachusetts, have enacted or will enact their own net 24 neutrality laws to address the Federal Communications 25 26 Commission's recent decision to overturn the 2015 net neutrality rules, thereby producing a patchwork of different laws in 27 different states; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, Hawaii has joined 22 other states in filing a petition to the United States Court of Appeals for the District 31 of Columbia Circuit seeking to prevent the Federal 32 Communications Commission from overturning the 2015 net 33 neutrality rules; now, therefore, 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 37 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, that Congress is urged to: 38



 Oppose the Federal Communications Commission's recent decision to overturn the 2015 net neutrality rules; and

(2) Pass legislation that would retain net neutrality nationwide, thus allowing individuals equal access to the internet, without any other type of interference or manipulation by internet service providers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the President and Vice President of 11 the United States, President Pro Tempore of the United States 12 Senate, Majority Leader of the United States Senate, Minority 13 Leader of the United States Senate, Speaker of the United States 14 House of Representatives, Minority Leader of the United States 15 House of Representatives, and members of Hawaii's Congressional 16 17 delegation.
