HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM CONVENE AN INTERNATIONAL MOON BASE ALLIANCE COMMITTEE TO PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS AND GUIDANCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF EVOLVABLE LUNAR ARCHITECTURE ON THE ISLAND OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has a strategic location near the equator 1 and in the middle of the Pacific Ocean, resident expertise in 2 aerospace-related technologies, and terrain that is similar to 3 the moon and Mars; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii has played a seminal role in the national 6 7 space program by providing astronaut training for the Apollo lunar missions and cutting-edge applications of aerospace-8 related technologies in planetary geosciences, satellite 9 communications, space-based remote sensing, environmental 10 monitoring, and deep-space surveillance; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, Hawaii has long-standing ties with space-faring nations worldwide; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the island of Hawaii's moon-like terrain provides 16 an ideal environment for the development, testing, and 17 validation of a prototype moon base that allows humans to live 18 on the surface of the moon to conduct research and commercial 19 operations, also known as evolvable lunar architecture; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the island of Hawaii can create jobs and 22 educational opportunities for local students, professionals, and 23 entrepreneurs as a venue for research related to 24 telecommunications, power generation, food production and life 25 support systems that would allow interplanetary travel; and 26 27 WHEREAS, new types of economic activity such as asteroid 28 mining, space-based solar power generation and the use of lunar 29 resources could enrich terrestrial civilization and help 30

preserve the Earth's fragile environment and ultimately enable 1 sustainable human exploration to Mars and beyond; now, 2 3 therefore. 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED that the House of Representatives of the 6 Twenty-ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 7 of 2018, that this body requests that the Department of 8 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism convene a committee 9 to be known as the International Moon Base Alliance, comprising 10 representatives from government, industry, and research institutions to provide recommendations and quidance for the 11 12 development of evolvable lunar architecture on the island of 13 Hawaii: and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 16 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to extend invitations to join the International Moon Base Alliance without 17 18 compensation to representatives of relevant government, industry, and university organizations, including but not 19 limited to: 20 21 Hawaii-based organizations, including the Office of 22 (1)23 Aerospace Development, the Hawaii Aerospace Advisory Committee, the Pacific International Space Center for 24 Exploration Systems, the Hawaii Space Laboratory at 25 the University of Hawaii at Manoa, and the Hawaii 26 Space Exploration Analog and Simulation program; 27 28 (2) The National Aeronautics and Space Administration, 29 including but not limited to the Space Portal at NASA 30 Ames Research Center and the Exploration Integration 31 and Science Office at the Johnson Space Center; 32 33 34 (3) Other appropriate federal entities and national space 35 agencies, including but not limited to the Federal Aviation Administration, United States Pacific 36 37 Command, and United States Army Pacific; 38 39 (4)The Lunar Exploration and Analysis Group; 40 The University Space Research Association, including 41 (5) the Lunar and Planetary Institute; 42

- (6) Major corporations representing aerospace, information technology, renewable energy, robotics, manufacturing, and other appropriate industrial sectors;
- (7) National space advocacy organizations, including the National Space Society, the Lunar Explorer Society, the Space Frontiers Foundation, and the American Astronautical Society;
- 10 (8) Global space agencies and organizations, including the
 11 United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs, the
 12 International Lunar Exploration Working Group, the
 13 International Space Exploration Coordination Group,
 14 and the Committee on Space Research; and
 - (9) The Chairs of the House Committees on Economic Development and Business and Veterans, Military & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, and the Chair of the Senate Committee on Economic Development, Tourism, and Technology, or their designees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 22 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to use its 23 resources and technology to encourage virtual meetings in order 24 25 to submit an interim report on the progress of the development of evolvable lunar architecture on the island of Hawaii to the 26 Legislature, including any findings, recommendations, and 27 28 necessary proposed legislation, no later than twenty days prior 29 to the convening of the Regular Session of 2019, and a final 30 report to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the 31 convening of the Regular Session of 2020; and 32

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; the Director of the 35 Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; the 36 National Aeronautics and Space Administration; the Federal 37 Aviation Administration; United States Pacific Command; and 38 United States Army Pacific.
