A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that electric motor
- 2 vehicles and hybrid motor vehicles decrease vehicle emissions,
- 3 helping the State progress toward its clean energy goals.
- 4 However, the legislature notes concerns that electric motor
- 5 vehicles and hybrid motor vehicles might not be contributing
- 6 their fair share to the state highway fund since they don't
- 7 consume, or consume limited quantities, of gasoline. The state
- 8 highway fund depends on three primary fee sources: the fuel tax,
- 9 weight tax, and vehicle registration fees. The fuel tax paid by
- 10 a driver is closely related to the amount of driving done by the
- 11 driver of non-electric, non-hybrid motor vehicles. Thus, these
- 12 drivers pay a fee that is related to the amount of road
- 13 degradation they contribute to when they drive. Because drivers
- 14 of electric motor vehicles and hybrid motor vehicles pay little
- 15 to no gas tax, these drivers do not pay for the road degradation
- 16 they contribute to.

- 1 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase the
- 2 registration fees for electric motor vehicles and hybrid motor
- 3 vehicles such that, in addition to the annual motor vehicle
- 4 registration fee, drivers of electric motor vehicles and hybrid
- 5 motor vehicles are assessed an additional annual registration
- 6 fee that is approximately equivalent to the gas tax they would
- 7 have paid if they drove a regular motor vehicle. The additional
- 8 registration fee is based on the average driving miles for all
- 9 vehicles, the average fuel efficiency of regular motor vehicles,
- 10 and the amount of the fuel tax.
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 249-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 1. By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 14 inserted and to read:
- ""Electric motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle powered
- 16 solely by an electric motor that draws current from rechargeable
- 17 storage batteries, fuel cells, photovoltaic arrays, or other
- 18 sources of electric current.
- 19 "Hybrid motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle powered by an
- 20 internal combustion engine and other propulsion that may be

- 1 dependent or independent in providing propulsion to the vehicle
- 2 in any forward or reverse gear."
- 3 2. By amending the definition of "motor vehicle" to read:
- 4 ""Motor vehicle" means every vehicle which is self-
- 5 propelled [and every vehicle which is propelled by electric
- 6 power but], including electric motor vehicles and hybrid motor
- 7 vehicles, which is not operated upon rails, but excludes
- 8 mopeds."
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 249-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§249-31 State registration fee. (a) All vehicles and
- 12 motor vehicles in the State as defined in section 249-1,
- 13 including antique motor vehicles, except as otherwise provided
- 14 in sections 249-4, 249-6, and 249-31.5, shall be subject to a
- 15 \$45 annual vehicle registration fee. Electric motor vehicles in
- 16 the State shall be subject to an additional \$70 annual vehicle
- 17 registration fee and hybrid motor vehicles in the State shall be
- 18 subject to an additional \$35 annual vehicle registration fee.
- 19 The [fee] fees shall be paid each year together with all other
- 20 taxes and fees levied by this chapter on a staggered basis as
- 21 established by each county as authorized by section 286-51, and

- 1 the state registration for that county shall likewise be
- 2 staggered so that the state registration [fee is] fees are due
- 3 and payable at the same time and shall be collected together
- 4 with the county fee. The state registration [fee] fees shall be
- 5 deemed delinquent if not paid with the county registration fee.
- 6 The respective counties shall collect [this fee] these fees
- 7 together with the vehicle registration tax collected for the
- 8 county and shall transfer the moneys collected under this
- 9 section to the State.
- 10 (b) From each annual motor vehicle registration fee, the
- 11 director shall deposit \$40 into the state highway fund and \$5
- 12 into the emergency medical services special fund. From the
- 13 additional annual motor vehicle registration fees for electric
- 14 motor vehicles and hybrid motor vehicles, the director shall
- 15 deposit the entire amount of the fee into the state highway
- 16 fund."
- 17 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the state highway
- 18 fund the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be
- 19 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the operations and
- 20 maintenance of the state highways program.

S.B. NO. 5.D. 2

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 transportation for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 6 provided that section 4 shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
