A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOVIE THEATERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 39, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2015 (Act 39), codified as section 489-9, Hawaii
- 3 Revised Statutes, requires a public accommodation that owns,
- 4 leases, leases to, or operates a motion picture theater in more
- 5 than two locations in the State to provide open movie captioning
- 6 at two showings per week. Open movie captioning provides a
- 7 display of text on the movie screen or via another visual
- 8 display that provides additional or interpretive information for
- 9 what is being presented.
- 10 The legislature further finds that one of the goals of
- 11 Act 39 was to improve accessibility for and reduce
- 12 discriminatory effects of communication barriers upon the deaf
- 13 and hard-of-hearing communities. The legislature additionally
- 14 finds that open movie captioning has enabled deaf and hard-of-
- 15 hearing consumers to enjoy movies in a similar fashion as those
- 16 who do not require open movie captioning.

1 Despite these laudable benefits, Act 211, Session Laws of 2 Hawaii 2017 (Act 211), amended section 489-9, Hawaii Revised 3 Statutes, to allow movie theaters the option of providing only 4 one open movie captioning showing per week or offering consumers 5 a personal closed captioning system, in the form of a 6 lightweight eyewear device. This amendment enabled movie 7 theaters to make eyewear devices available in lieu of offering 8 any showings with open movie captioning, thus depriving the deaf 9 and hard-of-hearing communities of a tremendous benefit. 10 The legislature notes that some movie theaters have 11 complied with Act 211 by providing open movie captioning during 12 matinee screenings only. Many members of the deaf and hard-of-13 hearing communities work and attend school, often making attendance at matinee screenings infeasible. The legislature 14 15 also notes that people have complained that the personal closed 16 captioning device permitted by Act 211 is unreliable and 17 uncomfortable to wear, especially with eyeglasses. 18 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to ensure that Hawaii 19 continues to support full access for persons with disabilities 20 through meaningful accessibility requirements for movie 21 theaters, by:

Act 39, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, as amended 10 by Act 211, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017, is amended by amending 11 section 3 to read as follows: "SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 12 13 2016 [and shall be repealed on January 1, 2018]." 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2035. 16

Report Title:

Motion Picture Theaters; Accommodation; Open Movie Captioning; Audio Description

Description:

Makes permanent the requirement for certain movie theaters to provide open movie captioning. Requires at least two showings per week, one with a scheduled start time no earlier than 4:30 p.m. and one on a Saturday or Sunday. Repeals the option of fulfilling the requirement with personal closed captioning screenings by means of lightweight eyewear. (SB1156 HD1)

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
