A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CIVIL SERVICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 76-77, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§76-77 Civil service and exemptions. The civil service 4 to which this part applies comprises all positions in the public 5 service of each county, now existing or hereafter established, and embraces all personal services performed for each county, 6 7 except the following: Positions in the office of the mayor; provided that 8 the positions shall be included in the classification 10 systems; 11 (2) Positions of officers elected by public vote, 12 positions of non-elected chief executive officers or 13 heads of the executive branch of county government, 14 positions of heads of departments, and positions of 15 one first deputy or first assistant of heads of 16 departments;

1	(3)	Positions of deputy country actorneys, deputy
2		corporation counsel, deputy prosecuting attorneys, and
3		law clerks;
4	(4)	Positions of members of any board, commission, or
5		agency;
6	(5)	Positions filled by students; positions filled through
7		federally funded programs which provide temporary
8		public service employment such as the federal
9		Comprehensive Employment and Training Act of 1973; and
.0		employees engaged in special research or demonstration
.1		projects approved by the mayor, for which projects
2		federal funds are available;
3	(6)	Positions of district judges, jurors, and witnesses;
4	(7)	Positions filled by persons employed by contract where
5	,	the personnel director has certified that the service
16		is special or unique, is essential to the public
17		interest, and that because of the circumstances
18		surrounding its fulfillment, personnel to perform the
9		service cannot be recruited through normal civil

service procedures; provided that no contract pursuant

4		interest where the need does not exceed ninety days;
5		provided that before any person may be employed to
6		render temporary service pursuant to this paragraph,
7		the director shall certify that the service is of a
8		temporary nature and that recruitment through normal

10		practicable; and provided further that the employment
11		of any person pursuant to this paragraph may be
12		extended for good cause for an additional period not
13		to exceed ninety days upon similar certification by
14		the director;
15	(9)	Positions of temporary election clerks in the office
16		of the county clerk employed during election periods;
17	(10)	Positions specifically exempted from this part by any

13	(14)	Positions of the housing and community development
14		office or department of each county; provided that
15		this exemption shall not preclude each county from
16		establishing these positions as civil service
17		positions;
18	(15)	The following positions in the office of the
19		prosecuting attorney: private secretary to the
20	·	prosecuting attorney, secretary to the first deputy
21		prosecuting attorney, and administrative or executive

1		assistants to the prosecuting attorney; provided that	
2		the positions shall be included in the classification	
3		systems; and	
4	(16)	Positions or contracts for personal services with	
5		private persons or entities for services lasting no	
6		more than one year and at a cost of no more than	
7		\$750,000; provided that the exemption under this	
8		paragraph shall apply to contracts for building,	
9	·	custodial, and grounds maintenance services with	
10		qualified community rehabilitation programs, as	
11		defined in section 103D-1001, lasting for no more than	
12	,	a year and at a cost of no more than \$850,000.	
13	The	director shall determine the applicability of this	
14	section t	o specific positions and shall determine whether or not	
15	positions exempted by paragraphs (7) and (8) shall be included		
16	in the classification systems.		
17	Nothing in this section shall be deemed to affect the civi		
18	service s	tatus of any incumbent private secretary of a	
19	departmen	t head who held that position on May 7, 1977."
