A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in today's economic
- 2 environment, government is left with diminishing financial
- 3 resources due to rising operating expenses. The legislature
- 4 further finds that the private sector in the State has shown a
- 5 desire to engage the public sector in collaborative and
- 6 constructive projects that can deliver infrastructure and public
- 7 asset projects more effectively and efficiently. The
- 8 legislature also finds that government is not currently equipped
- 9 to engage the private sector in a way that can expeditiously
- 10 execute public-private partnerships when the opportunity arises.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to establish an office of
- 12 public-private partnership within the department of business,
- 13 economic development, and tourism.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 16 to read as follows:

1	(3) Create and maintain an analysis report for each					
2	public-private partnership project that shall include					
3	(A) Proposed economic benefits;					
4	(B) Potential financial outcomes;					
5	(C) Contract terms and conditions; and					
6	(D) Social benefits; and					
7	(4) In collaboration with agencies and private businesses					
8	oversee and implement each public-private project."					
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general					
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so					
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and					
12	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal					
13	year 2018-2019 to establish and implement the office of public-					
14	private partnership and to establish positions to implement the					
15	purposes of this Act; provided that the positions may be added					
16	to the position count for the department of business, economic					
17	development, and tourism.					
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department					
19	of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes					
20	of this Act.

Report Title:

Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism; Office of Public-private Partnership; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes an office of public-private partnership within the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Requires that the office create a strategic plan; create collaboration amongst state agencies to identify and implement public-private projects; and oversee and implement the public-private projects. Makes an appropriation.
