BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 346-157, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:

- 4 requirement. [(a) For the purpose of this section, "liability
- 5 insurance coverage" means a general casualty insurance policy
- 6 issued to a provider insuring against legal liability for injury

- 8 is under the care of the child care provider.

- 10 obtain $[rac{and}{a}]$ maintain liability insurance coverage as a
- 11 condition of licensure, temporary permission, or registration to
- 12 operate a child care facility.

- 14 licensure, temporary permission, or registration, shall require
- 15 a provider who does not have liability insurance coverage to
- 16 disclose in writing that the provider does not have coverage to
- 17 each parent or guardian:
