BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 149A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1

- establish and administer a program relating to disclosure of 5

- §149A-B Mandatory disclosure requirements. (a) Beginning 8
- 9 July 1, 2018, all persons or entities that cultivate crops in
- 10 any calendar year shall disclose the use of all pesticides in
- accordance with this section. 11
- 12 (b) For each month of the reporting year, the person or
- entity shall report to the department the use of all pesticides 13
- 14 used in the preceding month. For each use, the report shall
- 15 include:
- The pesticide's trade name, federal and state 16 (1)
- registration or permit number, commercial product 17

Pesticides; Disclosure; Pesticide Use Revolving Fund

Description:

Requires the department of agriculture to establish a mandatory disclosure program for pesticide use by all persons or entities under certain circumstances. Defines the term "crops" as used in chapter 149A, HRS. Increases the pesticide use revolving fund balance ceiling to \$500,000.
