RELATING TO THE HOUSELESS BILL OF RIGHTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

9	§ -2 Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to								
10	ameliorate adverse effects on persons when they lack a home.								
11	§ -3 Houseless bill of rights; findings. The								
12	legislature finds that no person's rights, privileges, or access								
13	to public services may be denied solely because a person is								
14	houseless, and a houseless person should be granted the same								
15	rights as any other person.								
16	§ -4 Bill of rights. (a) The houseless bill of rights								
17	includes the following guarantees to houseless persons:								
18	(1) The right to engage in life-sustaining activities,								
19	including the right to use and move freely in public								
20	spaces, including but not limited to public sidewalks,								
21	public parks, public transportation, and public

3	(2)	The right to equal treatment by all state and county

6	(3)	The right to access fair housing and equal employment

10		shelter or social service provider;
11	(4)	The right to emergency medical care free from
12		discrimination on the basis of housing status;
13	(5)	The right to vote, register to vote, and receive
14		documentation necessary to prove identity for voting
15		without discrimination on the basis of housing status;
16	(6)	The right to protection from disclosure of records and
17		information, without proper legal authority, and the
18		right to confidentiality of records and information in
19		accordance with the federal Homeless Management
20		Information System, the Patient Protection and
21		Affordable Care Act (42 U.S.C. 18001 et seq.), and the

- (7) The right to access temporary and permanent shelters without discrimination on the basis of any protected class; and
- 6 (8) Action by the State and counties, or private 7 organization shall not impede an individual's ability to maintain access to services essential to survival, 8 9 including but not limited to medical services, shelter, food, and water; provided that as used in 10 this paragraph, "action by the State and counties" 11 12 shall not include law enforcement activities and efforts to promote health, safety, and welfare. 13
- The rights afforded to houseless persons to ensure 14 that their person, privacy, and property are safeguarded and 15 16 protected as set forth in this chapter are available only insofar as they are implemented in accordance with other state 17 or county laws, state rules and regulations, federal law, and 18 19 the constitutions of the State and the United States. Nothing 20 in this chapter shall be interpreted to create new legal rights 21 for houseless persons. This chapter is intended to ensure that

- 1 a houseless person is not discriminated against due to housing
- 2 status."
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
