A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that violence, whether
- 2 against humans or animals, must not be tolerated in our society.
- 3 To the extent that acts of cruelty to one animal has been linked
- 4 to cruelty to other animals and violence against humans, it is
- 5 necessary to ensure that persons convicted of cruelty to animals
- 6 are restricted from interacting with animals.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to:
- 8 (1) Require individuals convicted of animal abuse crimes9 to register as such, in order to prevent animal
- abusers from adopting, purchasing, or working closely
- with animals;
- 12 (2) Require animal shelters, pet stores, animal breeders,
- 13 zoos, and aquariums to check to see if an individual
- has been convicted of animal cruelty; and
- 15 (3) Require police officer training on identifying and
- investigating animal abuse.

1	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
2	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read
3	as follows:
4	"CHAPTER
5	REGISTRATION OF ANIMAL ABUSERS
6	§ -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the
7	context otherwise requires:
8	"Animal abuse" means an offense that is set forth in
9	section 711-1108.5 or 711-1109, or the comparable animal cruelty
10	statutes in any other state.
11	"Animal abuser" means a person who is or has been convicted
12	of animal abuse.
13	"Animal breeder" means any entity engaged in the practice
14	of facilitating the reproduction of animals for the purpose of
15	distributing the resulting offspring to one or more other
16	individuals or entities.
17	"Animal shelter" means a public or privately owned
18	organization including, but not limited to, any duly
19	incorporated humane society, pound, animal protective
20	association or animal rescue group which maintains buildings,
21	structures, or other property for the purpose of harboring



- 1 animals which may be stray, unwanted, lost, abandoned, or abused
- 2 and seeks to find appropriate temporary or permanent homes for
- 3 such animals.
- 4 "Attorney general" means the attorney general of the State
- 5 of Hawaii, the department of the attorney general, or an
- 6 authorized representative of the attorney general.
- 7 "Conviction" means a judgment on the verdict, or a finding
- 8 of guilt after a plea of guilty or nolo contendere, excluding
- 9 the adjudication of a minor, and occurs on the date judgment is
- 10 entered.
- 11 "Out-of-state conviction" means a conviction in any other
- 12 state of the United States, the District of Columbia, or the
- 13 five principal United States territories, including the
- 14 Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the Northern
- 15 Mariana Islands, and the United States Virgin Islands.
- 16 "Permanent residence" means a building, permanent structure
- 17 or unit therein, or watercraft where the animal abuser resides
- 18 and intends to reside indefinitely, or at least for the next one
- 19 hundred eighty days, and which the animal abuser owns, rents, or
- 20 occupies with the consent of the owner.

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"Pet store" means any place or premise where birds,
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    mammals, or reptiles are kept for the purpose of sale at either
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    wholesale or retail, import, export, barter, exchange, or gift.

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         "Temporary residence" means a building, permanent structure
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    or unit therein, watercraft, emergency shelter, or transitional
    housing facility where the animal abuser resides, but does not
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    intend to reside for more than one hundred eighty days.
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             -2 Registration requirements. All animal abusers
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    shall register with the attorney general and comply with the
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provisions of this chapter for life or for a shorter period of

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1 time as provided in this chapter. Registration under this 2 subsection is required whenever the animal abuser, whether or 3 not a resident of this State, remains in this State for more 4 than ten days or for an aggregate period exceeding thirty days 5 in one calendar year. An animal abuser shall be eliqible to 6 petition the court in a civil proceeding for an order that the 7 animal abuser's registration requirements under this chapter be 8 terminated, as provided in section 9 A person who establishes or maintains a residence in 10 this State and who has not been designated as an animal abuser 11 by a court of this State but who has been designated as an 12 animal abuser in another state or jurisdiction and was, as a 13 result of such designation, subjected to registration or 14 community or public notification, or both, or would be if the 15 person was a resident of that state or jurisdiction, without 16 regard to whether the person otherwise meets the criteria for 17 registration as an animal abuser, shall register in the manner 18 provided in this section. A person who meets the criteria of 19 this subsection is subject to the requirements and penalty 20 provisions of section -4 until the person successfully

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petitions the attorney general for termination of registration
requirements by:

- (1) Providing an order issued by the court that designated the person as an animal abuser designation in the state or jurisdiction in which the order was issued, which states that such designation has been removed or demonstrates to the attorney general that such designation, if not imposed by a court, has been removed by operation of law or court order in the state or jurisdiction in which the designation was made, and such person does not meet the criteria for registration as an animal abuser under the laws of this State; or
 - (2) Demonstrating that the out-of-state convictions upon which the animal abuser designation was established are not considered animal abuse under section -1, thereby showing that such person does not meet the criteria for registration as an animal abuser under the laws of this State.

20 If the animal abuser is not satisfied with the decision of the
21 attorney general on the request for termination of registration

1 requirements, the animal abuser may appeal the decision pursuant 2 to chapter 91. 3 Registration information for each animal abuser shall 4 contain a signed statement by the animal abuser containing: 5 (1) The name, all prior names, nicknames and pseudonyms, 6 and all aliases used by the animal abuser; 7 (2) The actual address and telephone number of the animal 8 abuser's permanent residence or the address of the 9 animal abuser's current temporary residence; 10 A statement listing all the offenses for which (3) registration is required, the city or town where the 11 12 offense occurred, the date of conviction or 13 adjudication, and the sentence imposed; and 14 (4) A current photograph of the animal abuser. 15 (d) Each animal abuser required to register with the 16 attorney general under this section shall register no later than 17 three working days after the earliest of: 18 (1) Arrival in this State; 19 (2) Release from incarceration; 20 (3) Release from commitment;

(4) Release on furlough;

7	§ -3 Requirement to register a change of registration			
8	information. An animal abuser required to register under this			
9	chapter, who changes any of the animal abuser's registration			
10	information after an initial registration with the attorney			
11	general, shall notify the attorney general of the new			
12	registration information in writing within three working days of			
13	the change. For purposes of this section, a person shall be			
14	deemed to have established a new residence during any period in			
15	which the person is absent from the person's registered			
16	residence for or more days. If, at any time, an animal			
17	abuser required to register under this chapter is absent from			
18	the person's registered residence for or more days, the			
19	animal abuser shall notify the attorney general in writing			
20	within three working days of the animal abuser's current			
21	residence information. If the animal abuser leaves the State

- 13 SECTION 3. Chapter 52D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "§52D- Police officers; training; animal abuse and
- 17 <u>animal cruelty.</u> (a) Each police commission established
- 18 pursuant to section 52D-1 shall establish a training program
- 19 that includes courses on how to identify and investigate animal
- 20 abuse. Each police officer shall complete a minimum of
- 21 hours of training every years.



1 (b) For purposes of this section, "police officer" means 2 any public servant employed by a county, vested by law with a 3 duty to maintain public order, to make arrests for offenses, or 4 to enforce the criminal laws, whether that duty extends to all 5 offenses or is limited to a specific class of offenses." 6 SECTION 4. Section 711-1108.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (5) to read as follows: 7 8 "(5) Cruelty to animals in the first degree is a class C 9 felony. In addition to any fines and imprisonment imposed under **10** this section, any person convicted under this section shall be 11 prohibited from possessing or owning any pet animal or equine 12 animal [for a minimum of five years from the date of 13 conviction.], or having employment or serving as a volunteer at 14 an animal shelter, pet store, animal breeder, zoo, or aquarium 15 while the person is required to comply with the registration 16 requirements in chapter ." 17 SECTION 5. Section 711-1109, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended by amending subsection (4) to read as follows: 19 "(4) Cruelty to animals in the second degree is a 20 misdemeanor, except where the offense involves ten or more pet 21 animals in any one instance which is a class C felony.

- 13 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Animal Abuser Registration; Animal Cruelty; Attorney General

Description:

Requires persons convicted of animal cruelty to register with the attorney general. Requires animal shelters, animal breeders, and pet stores to check whether an individual has been convicted of animal abuse when the individual applies to work or volunteer, or purchases or adopts an animal. Establishes penalties. Prevents persons convicted of animal cruelty from possessing, owning, or working in close proximity to animals. Requires police officers to be trained in identifying and investigating animal abuse.

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
