A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS TO ADDRESS HOMELESSNESS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coordinated
 statewide homeless initiative provides important, cost-effective
 homelessness prevention and rapid rehousing services statewide
 and increases coordination through the statewide information and
 referral system on behalf of homeless individuals and those at
 risk of homelessness.

7 The coordinated statewide homeless initiative originated in 8 April 2016 to help hundreds of families escape or avoid 9 homelessness. According to Aloha United Way, since the program 10 began, the program has helped more than one thousand four hundred households comprising four thousand eight hundred 11 12 individuals. About three-quarters of households had been at 13 risk of losing housing and the rest were already homeless. Of 14 these numbers, sixty-four per cent included children.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate moneys to continue and improve the coordinated statewide homeless initiative to prevent homelessness and rehouse homeless



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people in the State and to require the department of human
 services to procure services of a master contractor to manage
 subcontracts and expenditures for services provided through the
 initiative.

SECTION 2. (a) There is appropriated out of the general
revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$\$ or so much
thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to
continue and improve the coordinated statewide homeless
initiative, which shall be allocated as follows:

10 (1) \$ for the continuation of the statewide
11 homeless initiative; and

12 (2) \$ for landlord outreach and liaison activities
13 within the coordinated statewide homeless initiative,
14 subject to subsection (b).

15 (b) The following provisions shall apply to the16 appropriation under subsection (a):

17 (1) The department of human services shall:

18 (A) Procure the services of a master contractor to
19 procure and oversee subcontracts for the
20 provision of coordinated statewide homeless



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1			initiative services, in accordance with chapter
2			103D or 103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes;
3		(B)	Oversee the funds expended by the master
4			contractor; and
5		(C)	Develop policies and procedures for a fair and
6			equitable procurement process for subcontracts

9			consistent with the goals of public
10			accountability and public procurement practices;
11	(2)	The	master contractor shall:
12		(A)	Operate a coalition of agencies providing
13			homeless diversion services for the State by
14			providing short-term financial assistance to
15			households that have entered the eviction
16			process;
17		(B)	Coordinate with the coordinated entry system
18			mandated by the United States Department of
19			Housing and Urban Development to provide
20			navigation services and placement of homeless
21			households into permanent housing;



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1		(C)	At a minimum, provide quarterly reports to the
2			house of representatives and senate committees on
3			housing and human services, respectively;
4		(D)	Develop reporting procedures and timelines for
5			providing performance information to respective
6			state agencies; and
7		(E)	Be accountable for funds expended;
8	(3)	The	master contractor may retain administrative fees
9		up t	o fifteen per cent in total from the amounts paid
10		unde	r the master contract between the master
11		cont	ractor and subcontractors; and
12	(4)	The	total sum of funding shall be provided at the
13		star	t of the coordinated statewide homeless initiative
14		prog	ram to be managed by the master contractor;
15		prov	ided that the administration of the funds shall
16		conf	orm to accepted industry financial accounting and
17		perf	formance standards;
18	provided	furth	er that any subcontracts to the master contract
19	executed	and u	using the appropriations authorized pursuant to
20	this Act	shall	not be subject to chapters 42F, 103D, and 103F,

- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
