
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the modern digital
2 world influences media content of news on current events,
3 thereby shaping the public's perception of reality. Media
4 literacy is a necessary skill that allows all citizens to
5 access, analyze, and evaluate information using a variety of
6 forms of communication. At the same time, "digital citizens"
7 must have the ability to recognize and value the rights,
8 responsibilities, and opportunities of living, learning, and
9 working in an interconnected digital world in order to engage in
10 safe, legal, and ethical behaviors.

11 The legislature further finds that students from
12 kindergarten through grade twelve should be educated in media
13 literacy to obtain the skills and experiences needed to become
14 full participants in the digital world, including instruction in
15 understanding how media shapes perceptions.

16 The legislature also finds that students use technology to
17 play, learn, and communicate at school and home and need to



1 learn how to use technology responsibly. Students must
2 understand how to use personal technology in ways that augment
3 their learning experience, which is necessary to analyze and
4 evaluate information transmitted by media.

5 The legislature further finds that instruction in media
6 literacy should be incorporated into every classroom and every
7 curriculum content area to prepare students to live and work in
8 a digital world. Teachers have an obligation to guide students'
9 exploration of the digital landscape and encourage them to be
10 critical and creative thinkers.

11 The purpose of this Act is to authorize the department of
12 education to develop a plan to implement instruction on digital
13 citizenship and media literacy based on recommendations and
14 strategies provided by an advisory committee.

15 SECTION 2. (a) The department of education may convene an
16 advisory committee to make recommendations for purposes of
17 developing the plan under subsection (c). The advisory
18 committee shall include:

19 (1) Experts in media literacy, digital citizenship, and
20 internet safety, including academic experts and non-
21 profit organizations; and



(2) Other stakeholders, such as teachers, librarians, parent organizations, students, educators, and administrators.

(b) If an advisory committee is convened pursuant to subsection (a), no later than , 2019, the advisory committee shall make recommendations to the department on the following:

(1) Best practices, resources, and models for grade-appropriate instruction in media literacy, digital citizenship, and internet safety; provided that the recommendations shall comply with federal E-rate programs and the federal Children's Internet Protection Act;

(2) Strategies that will support the department in the implementation of the best practices identified by the advisory committee pursuant to paragraph (1), including strategies for delivering professional development to educators and administrators; and

(3) Any other matters deemed relevant by the advisory committee.



1 (c) The department may develop a plan to implement
2 instruction in digital citizenship and media literacy in grades
3 kindergarten to twelve in public schools, including charter
4 schools and Hawaiian language immersion schools, based upon the
5 recommendations provided by the advisory committee pursuant to
6 subsection (b).

7 (d) If a plan is developed pursuant to subsection (c), the
8 department shall submit an annual report to the legislature,
9 beginning on , 2019, on the department's plan, including
10 the timeline for implementing instruction in digital citizenship
11 and media literacy in grades kindergarten through twelve.

12 (e) For purposes of this section:

13 "Digital citizenship" means knowledge and skills necessary
14 for consumption of media, digital products, current technology,
15 and social media, including appropriate, responsible, and
16 healthy behavior, as well as cyberbullying prevention.

17 "Media literacy" means the ability to access, analyze,
18 evaluate, develop, produce, and interpret media, including the
19 thoughtful, safe, and strategic uses of online and other media
20 resources.

21 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
