A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VACANCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 17-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§17-3 State senator. (a) Whenever any vacancy in the
4 membership of the state senate occurs, the term of which ends at
5 the next succeeding general election:

The governor shall make an appointment within sixty 6 (1)calendar days following the first day of vacancy to 7 fill the vacancy for the unexpired term by selecting a 8 9 person from a list of three prospective appointees submitted by the same political party as the prior 10 incumbent. The appointee shall be at the time of 11 appointment, and for at least six months immediately 12 prior to the appointment, a member of the political 13 party. The appointee shall, at the time of 14 appointment, be a resident of the same senate district 15 as the prior incumbent. The political party shall 16 17 submit the list of prospective appointees to the



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1 governor within thirty calendar days following the first day of vacancy; and 2 3 (2) If the prior incumbent was not a member of any political party, the governor shall, within sixty 4 calendar days following the first day of vacancy, 5 appoint a person who is at the time of appointment a 6 7 resident of the same senate district as the prior incumbent and who is not, and has not been for at 8 least six months prior to the appointment, a member of 9 10 any political party. 11 In the case of a vacancy, the term of which does not (b) end at the next succeeding general election: 12 If it occurs not later than on the tenth day prior to 13 (1) 14 the close of filing for the next succeeding primary 15 election, as specified in section 12-6, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next 16 succeeding general election. The chief election 17 officer shall issue a proclamation designating the 18 election for filling the vacancy. Notwithstanding any 19 20 law to the contrary, all candidates for the unexpired term shall file nomination papers not later than the 21



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date and time specified in section 12-6 for the next 1 2 succeeding primary election. All candidates for the 3 unexpired term shall be nominated and elected in accordance with this title. Pending the election, the 4 governor shall make a temporary appointment to fill 5 the vacancy, and the person so appointed shall serve 6 7 until the election of the person duly elected to fill 8 the vacancy. The governor shall make the appointment 9 from a list of three prospective appointees submitted 10 by the same political party as the prior incumbent. The appointee shall be, at the time of the 11 appointment, and shall have been, for at least six 12 months immediately prior to the appointment, a member 13 14 of the political party. The appointee shall, at the 15 time of appointment, be a resident of the same senate 16 district as the prior incumbent. If the prior incumbent was not a member of any political party, the 17 governor shall appoint a person who is at the time of 18 19 appointment a resident of the same senate district as the prior incumbent and is not and has not been, for 20



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at least six months immediately prior to the 1 2 appointment, a member of any political party; 3 (2)If it occurs later than on the tenth day prior to the close of filing for the next succeeding primary 4 election but not later than [on-the sixtieth day prior 5 to] the close of filing for the next succeeding 6 7 primary election, or if there are no qualified candidates for any party or nonpartisan candidates 8 qualified for the primary election ballot, 9 10 notwithstanding any law to the contrary, nominations 11 for the unexpired term may be filed not later than 12 4:30 p.m. on the [fiftieth-day prior to the next 13 succeeding primary election.] tenth day after the 14 vacancy occurred, but if the day is a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, then at 4:30 p.m. on the first 15 16 working day immediately thereafter. The chief 17 election officer shall issue a proclamation 18 designating the election for filling the vacancy. 19 Pending the election the governor shall make a 20 temporary appointment to fill the vacancy and the person appointed shall serve until the election of the 21



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person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The governor 1 2 shall make the appointment from a list of three 3 prospective appointees submitted by the same political party as the prior incumbent. The appointee shall be, 4 at the time of the appointment, and shall have been, 5 6 for at least six months immediately prior to the 7 appointment, a member of the political party. The appointee shall, at the time of appointment, be a 8 9 resident of the same senate district as the prior 10 incumbent. If the prior incumbent was not a member of 11 any political party, the governor shall appoint a 12 person who is at the time of appointment a resident of 13 the same senate district as the prior incumbent and is 14 not and has not been, for at least six months immediately prior to the appointment, a member of any 15 16 political party; If it occurs after the [sixtieth day prior to] date 17 (3) 18 specified in section 12-6 for the close of filing 19 nomination papers for the next succeeding primary but not later than on the [fiftieth] ninety-fifth day 20

prior to the next succeeding general election, or if

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there are no qualified candidates for any party or 1 2 nonpartisan candidates in the primary, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term at the next 3 succeeding general election. The chief election 4 officer shall issue a proclamation designating the 5 election for filling the vacancy. Party candidates 6 7 for the unexpired senate term shall be nominated by 8 the county committees of the parties and the county 9 committees of the parties shall notify the chief 10 election officer not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 11 [fortieth] seventy-fifth day prior to the general election; provided that each nominated candidate fills 12 out an application for nomination papers and signs the 13 proper certification on the nomination paper and takes 14 15 either an oath or affirmation as provided by law; nonpartisan candidates may file nomination papers for 16 the unexpired term not later than 4:30 p.m. on the 17 [fortieth] seventy-fifth day prior to the general 18 19 election with the nonpartisan candidate who is to be nominated to be decided by lot, under the supervision 20 of the chief election officer. The candidates for the 21



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unexpired term shall be elected in accordance with 1 this title. Pending the election, the governor shall 2 make a temporary appointment to fill the vacancy, and 3 the person appointed shall serve until the election of 4 the person duly elected to fill the vacancy. The 5 governor shall make the appointment from a list of 6 three prospective appointees submitted by the same 7 political party as the prior incumbent. The appointee 8 shall be, at the time of the appointment, and shall 9 have been, for at least six months immediately prior 10 to the appointment, a member of the political party. 11 The appointee shall, at the time of appointment, be a 12 resident of the same senate district as the prior 13 incumbent. If the prior incumbent was not a member of 14 any political party, the governor shall appoint a 15 person who is at the time of appointment a resident of 16 the same senate district as the prior incumbent and is 17 not and has not been, for at least six months 18 immediately prior to the appointment, a member of any 19 political party; 20



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1 (4) If it occurs after the [fiftieth] ninety-fifth day prior to the next succeeding general election or if no 2 3 candidates are nominated, the governor shall make an appointment to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term 4 by selecting a person from a list of three prospective 5 appointees submitted by the same political party as 6 7 the prior incumbent. The appointee shall be, at the time of the appointment, and shall have been, for at 8 least six months immediately prior to the appointment, 9 10 a member of the political party. The appointee shall, 11 at the time of appointment, be a resident of the same senate district as the prior incumbent. If the prior 12 incumbent was not a member of any political party, the 13 14 governor shall appoint a person who is at the time of 15 appointment a resident of the same senate district as the prior incumbent and is not and has not been, for 16 at least six months immediately prior to the 17 appointment, a member of any political party." 18 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 20



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SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 begun before its effective date.

4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
