A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the east Hawaii				
2	child welfare services section in the county of Hawaii faces				
3	unique challenges as it is responsible for the safety and well-				
4	being of the State's most vulnerable children, including those				
5	who have been abused, neglected, or are at high risk for abuse				
6	and neglect. The office oversees the safety of endangered				
7	children in a large geographic area that extends from Honokaa to				
8	Ocean View, including the districts of north and south Hilo,				
9	Puna, and much of Hamakua and Kau. Furthermore, the rate of				
10	confirmed cases for abuse or neglect for Hawaii county in 2015				
11	was two hundred thirteen children per 100,000 residents, nearly				
12	triple the rate of confirmed cases for the city and county of				
13	Honolulu.				
14	The legislature further finds that due to challenging				
15	economic times and funding cuts in Hawaii's child welfare				
16	services, layoffs and hiring restrictions have caused the east				
17	Hawaii child welfare services section to lose nineteen of the				

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1	fifty-six positions it had in 2009, resulting in a dramatic				
2	increase in average caseload per caseworker. The recommended				
3	number of caseloads for child welfare services social workers is				
4	no more than fifteen children, but child welfare services socia				
5	workers in east Hawaii regularly have caseloads of forty to				
6	fifty children. These higher caseloads increase the potential				
7	for harm to children at risk for neglect or abuse, further				
8	contributing to the high rate of confirmed cases in Hawaii				
9	county, and has even prompted the family court to sanction the				
10	east Hawaii child welfare services section because of late				
11	filings of reports and failure to meet court deadlines.				
12	Therefore, the legislature finds that it is necessary to				
13	undertake a pilot project to demonstrate the positive impact of				
14	adequate staffing levels on the safety and well-being of at-ris				
15	children and families in east Hawaii.				
16	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for:				
17	(1) The department of human services to establish a five-				
18	year pilot program in the east Hawaii child welfare				
19	services section in Hawaii county that limits the				
20	number of children per child welfare services				
21	caseworker to no more than twenty; and				

1	(2)	Additional case managers and support staff for the	
2		pilot program.	
3	SECT	ON 2. There is appropriated out of the general	
4	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much	
5	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for:	
6	(1)	The department of human services, child welfare	
7		services branch, to establish a five-year pilot	
8		program that limits the number of children supervised	
9		by each child welfare services caseworker to no more	
10		than twenty in the east Hawaii child welfare services	
11		section in the county of Hawaii, provided that the	
12		pilot program shall commence on July 1, 2018 and shall	1
13		terminate on June 30, 2023; and	
14	(2)	Eight full-time equivalent (8.0 FTE) case managers an	ıd
15		fifteen full-time equivalent (15.0 FTE) support staff	:
16		positions for the pilot program.	
17	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department o	£
18	human services for the purposes of this Act.		
19	SECT	ION 3. The department of human services shall submit	а
20	report of	its findings and recommendations relating to the pilo	٠t

program, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature

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- 1 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- **2** session of 2019.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Description:

Appropriates funds for the Department of Human Services (DHS) to establish a five-year pilot program in the east Hawaii child welfare services section in Hawaii County that limits the number of children per child welfare services caseworker to no more than twenty.
