A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I	
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are nearly	
3	10,000 pesticides registered for use in Hawaii. The department	
4	of agriculture is responsible for ensuring pesticides are used	
5	correctly in Hawaii. The legislature further finds that it is	
6	in the interest of the public to enhance the ability of the	
7	department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college	
8	of tropical agriculture and human resources to respond to	
9	questions about pesticide use and make recommendations regarding	
10	pesticides for the protection of public safety and the	
11	environment. The legislature concludes that this can best be	
12	accomplished by increasing the pesticide licensing fee and	
13	amending the authorized uses of the pesticide use revolving	
14	fund.	
15	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:	
16	(1) Increase the pesticide licensing fee and require	
17	annual renewal of the license;

3	(3)	Establish an environmental toxicologist position
4		within the department of agriculture and a pesticide
5		extension specialist, through a contract with the
6		department of agriculture, within the University of
7		Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
8		resources; and

10		fund for specific purposes.

11	(1)	Licensing and registration fees and charges collected
12		by the department under section 149A-13(b);
13	(2)	All fees collected by the department [through the
14		collection of for educational programs and training
15		[fees] programs in accordance with subsection (c); and
16	(3)	Funds appropriated for the pesticide subsidy program
17		established under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii
18		2014.
19	(b)	[Moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund shall be
20	expended k	y the department to support the pesticide program's
21	registrati	on and licensing, certification and education, and

1	compliance monitoring activities. The department shall also
2	expend revolving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
3	training workshops, educational programs, development of
4	integrated pest management strategies, the pesticide subsidy
5	program created under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, and
6	other services for pesticide users such as the agricultural pest
7	control industry, the structural pest control industry, and
8	consumer users of pesticides, which provide pesticide
9	instruction in areas including but not limited to the
10	collection, disposal, and recycling of pesticide containers and
11	all other pesticide services deemed necessary by the
12	department.] Moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund may
13	be used for personnel, services, materials, and equipment for
14	the purposes of this section[; provided that the use of moneys
15	from the revolving fund for personnel costs shall be limited to
16	those employees under the registration and education section of
17	the department's pesticides branch.
18	Moneys expended by the department from the pesticide use
19	revolving fund for training workshops, educational programs, and
20	other services for the agricultural pest control industry, the
21	structural pest control industry, and consumer groups shall be

1	expended	in a manner that appropriately addresses the needs of
2	each cate	gory of pesticide user].
3	Mone	ys in the pesticide use revolving fund shall be
4	expended	by the department for:
5	(1)	Pesticide registration and technical review;
6	(2)	Certification, including certification of restricted
7		use pesticides or experimental use pesticides;
8	(3)	Compliance monitoring activities;
9	(4)	Development of an electronic data collection system
10		for all required pesticide reporting;
11	(5)	Personnel costs, including the hiring of necessary
12		<pre>staff;</pre>
13	(6)	Development of pesticide-related educational materials
14		in conjunction with the University of Hawaii college
15		of tropical agriculture and human resources;
16	<u>(7)</u>	Demonstration trials in conjunction with the
17		University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture
18		and human resources cooperative extension service
19		agents to develop integrated management and drift
20		management technologies; and
21	(8)	A pesticide disposal program.



1	The department shall also expend revolving fund moneys on
2	the pesticide subsidy program created under Act 105, Session
3	Laws of Hawaii 2014, and shall partner with the University of
4	Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources to
5	expend revolving fund moneys on the establishment of pesticide
6	education programs and pesticide training programs and for the
7	establishment of a position of pesticide extension specialist.
8	(c) The department may set fees for [the] any educational
9	[services] programs and training programs provided under this
10	section.
11	(d) All interest earned on the deposit or investment of
12	the moneys in the fund shall become a part of the fund.
13	[(e) All unobligated, unencumbered, or unexpended funds
14	remaining in the fund in excess of \$250,000 at the close of each
15	fiscal year shall lapse to the state general fund.
16	$\frac{(f)}{(e)}$ The department shall submit an annual report to
17	the legislature on all moneys deposited into, and disbursed
18	from, the pesticide use revolving fund. The report shall be
19	submitted to the legislature not fewer than twenty days prior to
20	the convening of each regular session. The report shall
21	[group]:

1	(1)	Group all moneys deposited into, and disbursed from,
2		the revolving fund according to the categories
3		established in subsections (a) to [(e).] <u>(d);</u>
4	(2)	Include recommendations to improve pesticide education
5		and regulatory processes within the State; and
6	(3)	Include recommendations for budget reallocations for
7		the subsequent fiscal year."

9	SECTI	ON 4. (a) The department of agriculture and the
10	University	of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
11	resources	shall execute a memorandum of understanding regarding
12	the expend	iture of moneys from the pesticide use revolving fund
13	pursuant t	o section 149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes.
14	(b)	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
15	the regula	r session of 2019, and each regular session
16	thereafter	, the department of agriculture and University of
17	Hawaii col	lege of tropical agriculture and human resources shall
18	submit a r	eport to the legislature on all moneys expended from
19	the pestic	ide use revolving fund in accordance with the
20	memorandum	of understanding required under subsection (a).

- 1 SECTION 5. (a) There is established within the department
- 2 of agriculture the position of environmental toxicologist. The
- 3 position shall be exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised
- 4 Statutes. The environmental toxicologist shall partner with the
- 5 department of health toxicologist to expand the technical
- 6 capacity of the departments of agriculture and health to analyze
- 7 findings and make recommendations regarding environmental and
- 8 human health.
- 9 (b) There shall be a memorandum of understanding between
- 10 the department of agriculture environmental toxicologist and the
- 11 department of health toxicologist that defines a collaborative
- 12 relationship between the two positions.
- 13 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 14 revolving fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 15 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for operating expenses and
- 16 the position of environmental toxicologist established under
- 17 section 5 of this Act.
- 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 19 agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 7. There is established within the University of
- 21 Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources the



1	position	or pesticide extension specialist, to be inneed by the
2	pesticide	use revolving fund through a contract with the
3	department	of agriculture. The pesticide extension specialist
4	shall be	responsible for:
5	(1)	Developing educational materials in conjunction with
6		the department of agriculture pursuant to section
7		149A-13.5(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes;
8	(2)	Working with the environmental toxicologist
9		established under section 5 of this Act to design
10		experiments; and
11	(3)	Exploring partnerships with other agencies for funding
12		opportunities.
13	SECT	ON 8. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
14	revolving	fund the sum of \$200,000 or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary	for fiscal year 2018-2019 for operating expenses and
16	the posit	on of pesticide extension specialist established under
17	section 7	of this Act.
18	The s	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

agriculture exclusively for the purposes of this Act.

PART IV

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- 1 SECTION 9. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 2 revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 3 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for pesticide registration
- 4 and technical review.
- 5 SECTION 10. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 6 revolving fund the sum of \$25,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 7 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for certification
- 8 activities, including certification of restricted use pesticides
- 9 or experimental use pesticides.
- 10 SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 11 revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 12 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for compliance monitoring
- 13 expenses.
- 14 SECTION 12. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 15 revolving fund the sum of \$750,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 16 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the development of an
- 17 electronic data collection system for all required pesticide
- 18 reporting.
- 19 SECTION 13. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 20 revolving fund the sum of \$400,000 or so much thereof as may be

- 1 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the development of
- pesticide-related educational materials.
- 3 SECTION 14. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 4 revolving fund the sum of \$300,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 5 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to conduct demonstration
- 6 trials in conjunction with the University of Hawaii college of
- 7 tropical agriculture and human resources cooperative extension
- 8 service agents to develop integrated management and drift
- 9 management technologies.
- 10 SECTION 15. There is appropriated out of the pesticide use
- 11 revolving fund the sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be
- 12 necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the pesticide disposal
- 13 program.
- 14 SECTION 16. The sums appropriated by sections 9 to 15
- 15 shall be expended by the department of agriculture exclusively
- 16 for the purposes of this Act.
- 17 PART V
- 18 SECTION 17. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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1 SECTION 18. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

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Report Title:

Pesticides; Licensing; Fees; Pesticide Use Revolving Fund; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the pesticide licensing fee and requires annual renewal of the license. Amends authorized uses for moneys in the pesticide use revolving fund. Requires memorandum of understanding between the department of agriculture and the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources regarding the expenditure of funds from the pesticide use revolving fund and a report to the legislature. Establishes an environmental toxicologist position within the department of agriculture and a pesticide extension specialist, through a contract with the department of agriculture, within the University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human resources. Appropriates funds out of the pesticide use revolving fund for specific purposes.

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
