### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 42F-103, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:
3	"(b)	In addition, a grant may be made to an organization
4	only if t	he organization:
5	(1)	Is incorporated under the laws of the State; [and]
6	(2)	Has bylaws or policies that describe the manner in
7		which the activities or services for which a grant is
8		awarded shall be conducted or provided $[-]$ ;
9	(3)	Is in compliance with all registration and annual
10		reporting requirements of the department of commerce
11		and consumer affairs; and
12	(4)	Provides proof of a current and valid general excise
13		tax license pursuant to section 237-9.
14	(c)	Further, a grant may be awarded to a nonprofit
15	organization only if the organization:	
16	(1)	Has been determined and designated to be a nonprofit
17		organization by the Internal Revenue Service; [and]

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1	(2)	Has a governing board whose members have no material
2		conflict of interest and serve without
3		compensation[-];
4	(3)	Provides proof of a current and valid general excise
5		tax license pursuant to section 237-9;
6	(4)	Is registered with the department of the attorney
7		general as a charitable organization pursuant to
8		section 467B-2.1, if applicable;
9	(5)	Provides proof of the filing of Internal Revenue
10		Service form 990, 990EZ, or 990-N; and
11	(6)	Is current on the payment of all real property taxes,

Grants; Requirements

#### Description:

Requires all organizations that may receive a grant from the State to be in compliance with all registration and annual reporting requirements of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs and provide proof of a current and valid general excise tax license. Requires all nonprofit organizations that may receive a grant from the State to provide proof of a current and valid general excise tax license; register with the Department of the Attorney General as a charitable organization, if applicable; provide proof of the filing of Internal Revenue Service form 990, 990EZ, or 990-N; and be current on the payment of all real property taxes, if applicable.

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
