14	(2) The different types of cooling measures implemented;
15	(3) The approximate cost per classroom for planned cooling
16	measures, including installation, upgrades, equipment,
17	maintenance, and projected operating costs over the
18	life of the installed cooling measures;
19	(4) The approximate cost per completed classroom for
20	cooling measures implemented, including installation,
21	upgrades, equipment, maintenance, and projected

measures; (5) The number of completed classrooms in which e efficiency measures were installed or impleme the number of classrooms remaining that requi efficiency measures; and (6) The different types of energy efficiency meas installed or implemented. [(f)] The department shall report its findings an recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to legislature no later than twenty days prior to the conv each regular session." SECTION 2.
