### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 712, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to rea	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§71</u>	2- Exploitative advertising. (1) A person commits
5	the offen	se of exploitative advertising if the person:
6	<u>(a)</u>	Uses in any print, broadcast, or electronic
7		advertisements, or advertisement directories that
8		include the word "massage", "relaxation", "spa", "body
9		rubs", "sex", or "erotic", images depicting any person
10		being advertised as a massage therapist, relaxation
11		therapist, escort, or employee in a nude condition; or
12	<u>(b)</u>	Refers to the intimate areas of a person being
13		advertised as a massage therapist, relaxation
14		therapist, escort, or other employee in any print,
15		broadcast, or electronic advertisement or
16		advertisement directories that include the word

1	"massage", "relaxation", "spa", "escort", "body rubs",
2	"sex", or "erotic".
3	(2) This section shall not apply to any owners,
4	publishers, providers, producers, operators, managers, or
5	moderators of a print, broadcast, or electronic advertisement
6	directory, or classified advertisement website, who are acting
7	in accordance with the scope of their professional
8	responsibilities.
9	(3) Exploitative advertising is a misdemeanor. In
10	addition to any penalties the court may impose, the court may
11	order the destruction or deletion of any advertisement made in
12	violation of this section."
13	SECTION 2. Section 712-1210, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by adding seven new definitions to be appropriately
15	inserted and to read as follows:
16	""Advertise" includes but is not limited to:
17	(a) Issuing any card, sign, or device to any person;
18	(b) Causing, permitting, or allowing any sign or marking
19	on or in any building, vehicle, or structure;
20	(c) Advertising in any newspaper or magazine;
21	(d) Broadcasting commercials by airwave transmission; or

1	(e) Distributing commercial messages through any
2	electronic communication system, including but not
3	limited to the Internet.
4	"Escort" means any person who provides company to other
5	persons for amusement, companionship, or entertainment at any
6	public or private location in exchange for a fee; provided that
7	the term shall not include companionship services for the aged
8	or infirm under section 387-1.
9	"Intimate areas" has the same meaning as in section
10	<u>711-1111.</u>
11	"Massage therapist" has the same meaning as in section
12	<u>452-1.</u>
13	"Massage therapy" has the same meaning as in section 452-1.
14	"Relaxation therapist" means a person who engages in the
15	occupation or practice of relaxation therapy for compensation.
16	"Relaxation therapy" means any non-medical method of
17	practicing healing arts other than massage therapy that is
18	intended to help a person relax, attain a state of increased
19	calmness, or otherwise reduce pain, anxiety, stress, anger, or
20	depression, including but not limited to reflexology and spa
21	treatment services."
