A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREWORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted				
3	and to read as follows:				
4	""Public display" means any display of fireworks conducted				
5	for and open to the public at large, regardless of whether or				
6	not an admission price is charged, and regardless of the source				
7	of funding for the display. "Public display" also means any				
8	display conducted as part of any movie or television production				
9	"Public display" does not include any display conducted				
10	primarily for the benefit of a private party. "Public display"				
11	includes:				
12	(1) Any display conducted by the State or counties or any				
13	municipal subdivision thereof for the benefit of its				
14	residents;				
15	(2) Any display conducted by a nonprofit or community				
16	organization for the benefit of the community;				

1	(3) Any display conducted by a hotel for the benefit of					
2	its guests; and					
3	(4) Any display conducted as a part of a concert, play,					
4	theatrical production, sporting event, parade, or					
5	other public event."					
6	SECTION 2. Section 132D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
7	amended by amending the definition of "consumer fireworks" to					
8	read as follows:					
9	""Consumer fireworks" means any fireworks designed					
10	primarily for retail sale to the public during authorized dates					
11	and times, that produces visible or audible effects by					
12	combustion, and that is designed to remain on or near the ground					
13	and, while stationary or spinning rapidly on or near the ground					
14	emits smoke, a shower of colored sparks, whistling effects,					
15	flitter sparks, or balls of colored sparks, and includes					
16	combination items that contain one or more of these effects.					
17	"Consumer fireworks" shall comply with the construction,					
18	chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the United					
19	States Consumer Product Safety Commission as set forth in Title					
20	16 Code of Federal Regulations and fireworks classified as					
21	UN0336 and UN0337 by the United States Department of					

- 1 Transportation as set forth in Title 49 Code of Federal
- 2 Regulations. "Consumer fireworks" include firework items
- 3 commonly known as firecrackers that are single paper cylinders
- 4 not exceeding one and one-half inches in length excluding the
- 5 fuse and one-quarter of an inch in diameter and contain a charge
- 6 of not more than fifty milligrams of pyrotechnic composition,
- 7 snakes, sparklers, fountains, and cylindrical or cone fountains
- 8 that emit effects up to a height not greater than twelve feet
- 9 above the ground, illuminating torches, bamboo cannons,
- 10 whistles, toy smoke devices, wheels, and ground spinners that
- 11 when ignited remain within a circle with a radius of twelve feet
- 12 as measured from the point where the item was placed and
- 13 ignited, novelty or trick items, combination items, and other
- 14 fireworks of like construction that are designed to produce the
- 15 same or similar effects. The manufacture, import, sale, and use
- 16 of consumer fireworks is prohibited."
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 132D-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "§132D-3 [Permissible uses of consumer] Consumer
- 20 fireworks[-]; prohibited. [Consumer fireworks may be set off,

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    ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to explode within the
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    State only:
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         (1) From 9:00 p.m. on New Year's Eve to 1:00 a.m. on New
              Year's Day; from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on Chinese New
              Year's Day; and from 1:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on the

              Fourth of July; or
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         (2) From 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. as allowed by permit

              pursuant to section 132D-10 if the proposed cultural
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              use is to occur at any time other than during the
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              periods prescribed in paragraph (1);
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    provided that the purchase of not more than five thousand
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    individual consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers
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    shall be allowed under each permit.] The manufacture,

    distribution, import, purchase, sale, and use of consumer
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    fireworks is prohibited."
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         SECTION 4. Section 132D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "$132D-4 Permissible uses of display fireworks, articles
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    pyrotechnic, and aerial devices. (a) Display fireworks,
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    articles pyrotechnic, and aerial devices may be purchased, set
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    off, ignited, or otherwise caused to explode in the State only
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- 1 if for display and permitted in writing pursuant to sections
- 2 132D-10 and 132D-16.
- 3 (b) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial
- 4 devices shall be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise
- 5 caused to explode within the State only from 9:00 a.m. to
- 6 9:00 p.m.; provided that the applicable county fire chief may
- 7 extend the time period for special events; provided further that
- 8 the time restriction established in this subsection shall not
- 9 apply to display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial
- 10 devices set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise caused to
- 11 explode within the State solely as part of a movie or television
- 12 production.
- 13 (c) Display fireworks, articles pyrotechnic, and aerial
- 14 devices shall be set off, ignited, discharged, or otherwise
- 15 caused to explode within the State only as part of a public
- 16 display."
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 132D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "§132D-5 General prohibitions. $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$ It shall be
- 20 unlawful for any person without a permit issued under section
- 21 132D-10 by a county fire department to:

3	canefield; or within one thousand feet of any
4	building used for public worship during the
5	periods when services are held; and
6	$[\frac{(G)}{(G)}]$ Within five hundred feet of any hotel.
7	[(b) It shall be unlawful to purchase consumer fireworks
8	more than five calendar days before the time periods for
9	permissible use under section 132D-3.
10	(c) It shall be unlawful to sell consumer fireworks after
11	12:01 a.m. on New Year's Day, 6:00 p.m. on Chinese New Year's
12	Day, and 8:00 p.m. on the Fourth of July.]"
13	SECTION 6. Section 132D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	"\$132D-7 License or permit required. A person shall not:
16	(1) Import, store, offer to sell, or sell, at wholesale or
17	retail, aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
18	pyrotechnic, [or consumer fireworks] unless the person
19	has a valid license issued by the county; or
20	(2) Possess aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
21	pyrotechnic without a valid license to import, store,

1	or sell aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
2	pyrotechnic, or a valid display permit as provided for
3	in this chapter."
4	SECTION 7. Section 132D-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
6	"(d) It shall be unlawful for any licensee, other than a
7	wholesaler who is selling or transferring fireworks or articles
8	pyrotechnic to a licensed retailer, to sell or offer to sell,
9	exchange for consideration, give, transfer, or donate any
10	fireworks or articles pyrotechnic at any time to any person who
11	does not present a permit duly issued as required by section
12	132D-10 or 132D-16. The permit shall be signed by the seller or
13	transferor at the time of sale or transfer of the fireworks or
14	articles pyrotechnic, and the seller or transferor shall
15	indicate on the permit the amount and type of fireworks or
16	articles pyrotechnic sold or transferred. No person shall sell
17	or deliver fireworks to any permittee in any amount in excess of
18	the amount specified in the permit, less the amount shown on the
19	permit to have been previously purchased[; provided that no
20	fireworks shall be sold to a permittee holding a permit issued

1 for purposes of section 132D-3, more than five calendar days 2 before the applicable time period under section 132D-3]." 3 SECTION 8. Section 132D-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 "§132D-9 Application for permit. The permit required 6 under section 132D-10 or 132D-16 shall be issued by the county 7 or its authorized designees and be nontransferable. The county or its authorized designees shall issue all permits for which 8 9 complete applications have been submitted and which contain only 10 correct information. The permit shall specify the date of 11 issuance or effect and the date of expiration but in no case for 12 a period to exceed one year. [The permit for the purchase of 13 consumer fireworks for the purposes of section 132D-3 shall not 14 allow purchase for more than one event as set forth in section 15 132D-3.] The application shall be made on a form setting forth 16 the dates for which the permit shall be valid, the location 17 where the permitted activity is to occur, and the name of the 18 proprietor or, if a partnership, the name of the partnership and 19 the names of all partners or, if a corporation, the name of the 20 corporation and the names of its officers. The permit 21 application may be denied if the proposed use of fireworks or

- 1 articles pyrotechnic presents a substantial inconvenience to the
- 2 public or presents an unreasonable fire or safety hazard. Any
- 3 permit issued pursuant to this chapter shall be prominently
- 4 displayed in public view at the site."
- 5 SECTION 9. Section 132D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "\$132D-10 Permits. A permit shall be required for the
- 8 purchase and use of [+
- 9 (1) Any consumer fireworks commonly known as firecrackers
- 10 upon payment of a fee of \$25;
- 11 (2) Any] any aerial devices, display fireworks, or
- 12 articles pyrotechnic for the purposes of section 132D-
- 13 l6 upon payment of a fee of \$110[; and
- 14 (3) Any consumer fireworks for the purposes of section
- 15 132D-5 or for cultural uses that occur at any time
- 16 other than during the periods prescribed in section
- 18 SECTION 10. Section 132D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "\$132D-12 Sale to minors; sale by minors; prohibited. It
- 21 shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale, sell, or



- 1 give any fireworks or articles pyrotechnic to minors, and for
- 2 any minor to possess, purchase, sell, or set off, ignite, or
- 3 otherwise cause to explode any fireworks or articles
- 4 pyrotechnic[, except as provided in section 132D-13]."
- 5 SECTION 11. Section 132D-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "\$132D-13 Liability of parents or guardians. The parents,
- 8 guardian, and other persons having the custody or control of any
- 9 minor, who knowingly permit the minor to possess, purchase, or
- 10 set off, ignite, or otherwise cause to explode any fireworks or
- 11 articles pyrotechnic, shall be deemed to be in violation of this
- 12 chapter and shall be subject to the penalties thereunder[7
- 13 except that the parents or quardian may allow the minor to use
- 14 consumer fireworks while under the immediate supervision and
- 15 control of the parent or quardian, or under the supervision and
- 16 control of another adult]."
- 17 SECTION 12. Section 132D-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended as follows:
- 1. By amending subsection (b) to read:
- 20 "(b) The application shall state, among other things:
- 21 (1) The name, age, and address of the applicant;



I	(2)	The name, age, and address of the person who will			
2		operate the display, and verification that the person			
3		is a licensed and trained pyrotechnic operator;			
4	(3)	The time, date, and place of the display;			
5	(4)	The type and quantity of aerial devices, display			
6		fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic to be displayed;			
7		and			
8	(5)	The purpose or occasion for which the display is to be			
9		presented."			
10	2.	By amending subsection (d) to read:			
11	"(d)	The county, pursuant to duly adopted rules, shall			
12	issue the	permit after being satisfied that the requirements of			
13	subsection	n (c) have been met, the display will be handled by a			
14	trained pyrotechnic operator duly licensed by the State, the				
15	display will not be hazardous to property, and the display will				
16	not endanger human life. The permit shall authorize the holder				
17	to display aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles				
18	pyrotechnic only at the place and during the time set forth				
19	therein,	and to acquire and possess the specified aerial			
20	devices,	display fireworks, or articles pyrotechnic between the			
21	date of t	he issuance of the permit and the time during which the			

- 1 display of those aerial devices, display fireworks, or articles
- pyrotechnic is authorized."
- 3 SECTION 13. Section 132D-16.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "[{| §132D-16.6[}] Display site inspection. Each county
- 6 fire chief is authorized to conduct inspections of the persons
- 7 conducting a display, including the site where the display is
- 8 occurring or will occur within the fire chief's county to
- 9 determine compliance with the applicable county code and the
- 10 current editions of the National Fire Protection Association's
- 11 "NFPA 1123: Code for Fireworks Display" and "NFPA 1126:
- 12 Standard for the Use of Pyrotechnics Before a Proximate
- 13 Audience". An inspection fee of \$200 shall be assessed by the
- 14 county upon the holder of a permit for a display under section
- 15 $\left[\frac{132D-10(2)}{7}\right]$ 132D-10, which shall be separate from the display
- 16 permit fee under that section. The inspection fee shall be paid
- 17 to the county in which the display will occur, and shall be used
- 18 to defray the cost of the official conducting the inspection of
- 19 the display setup."

- 1 SECTION 14. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 2 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 3 were begun before its effective date.
- 4 SECTION 15. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 16. This Act shall take effect on April 1, 2019.
