A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ABANDONED VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that abandoned vehicles
- 2 on public roads are a widespread environmental disaster that can
- 3 impact human health and safety.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to require the counties to
- 5 remove and dispose of abandoned vehicles on public roads within
- 6 ten business days.
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 290-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 9 "(a) The counties [may] shall cause vehicles that have
- 10 been abandoned to be taken into custody [and disposed of.]
- 11 within ten business days of abandonment. For the purposes of
- 12 this subsection, a vehicle is "abandoned" if it is defined to be
- 13 abandoned by an ordinance of the county in which the vehicle is
- 14 located. In the absence of such an ordinance, a vehicle is
- 15 "abandoned" if it is left unattended for a continuous period of
- 16 more than twenty-four hours and it is unlawfully parked on any
- 17 public highway or other public property or private lands defined



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- 1 as a setback, shoulder, easement, or right of way that is
- 2 adjacent to or part of a public highway. The mayors of the
- 3 several counties may designate an agency within their counties
- 4 to carry out the functions and requirements of this section.
- 5 The term "agency" means any office, department, or other
- 6 governmental unit of the county."
- 7 SECTION 3. Section 290-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 9 "(a) Upon taking custody of any abandoned vehicle $[\tau]$ that
- 10 has been reported stolen, a written notice shall immediately be
- 11 sent by registered or certified mail to the legal and registered
- 12 owner of the vehicle at the address on record at the vehicle
- 13 licensing division. The notice shall contain a brief
- 14 description of the vehicle, the location of custody, and
- 15 intended disposition of the vehicle if not repossessed within
- 16 ten days after the mailing of the notice, or in the case where
- 17 the address of the registered owner on record at the vehicle
- 18 licensing division is an out-of-state address, within twenty
- 19 business days after the mailing of the notice. A notice need
- 20 not be sent to a legal or registered owner or any person with an
- 21 unrecorded interest in the vehicle whose name or address cannot

- 1 be determined. Absent evidence to the contrary, a notice shall
- 2 be deemed received by the legal or registered owner five days
- 3 after the mailing."
- 4 SECTION 4. Section 290-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 "§290-8 Derelict vehicle. A vehicle shall be deemed a
- 7 derelict vehicle by the administrative head of the county agency
- 8 designated to carry out section 290-1, or by the executive
- 9 director or a representative of the executive director of the
- 10 Hawaii public housing authority in the case of a vehicle that
- 11 has been abandoned on property owned, managed, or administered
- 12 by the authority, if a major [parts have] part has been removed
- 13 or material damage to the vehicle has rendered the vehicle
- 14 inoperable and one of the following conditions exists:
- 15 (1) The vehicle is registered for the current registration
- 16 period and the registered and legal owners no longer
- reside at the addresses on record with the county
- director of [finance;] customer services;
- 19 (2) The vehicle has been registered for the current or
- 20 previous registration period and the registered and
- legal owners disclaim ownership[+], or a Notice of

1		Transfer has been submitted by the registered and
2		legal owners and recorded with the director of
3		customer services and the new owner has not
4		transferred the title or registration into the new
5		owner's name within thirty days of release;
6	(3)	The vehicle identification number and license plates
7		have been removed so as to nullify efforts to locate
8		or identify the current registered and legal owners;
9	(4)	The vehicle has not been registered for the [current
10		or] previous twelve month [registration periods;]
11		<pre>period; or</pre>
12	(5)	The vehicle registration records of the county
13		director of finance contain no record that the vehicle
14		has ever been registered in the county.
15	Prior to	authorizing the removal of a derelict vehicle, the
16	administr	ative head of the county agency designated to carry out
17	section 2	90-1 or the executive director or a representative of
18	the execu	tive director of the Hawaii public housing authority in
19	the case	of vehicles that have been abandoned on property owned,
20	managed,	or operated by the authority, shall notify the county

- 1 chief of police only if the vehicle is reported stolen or
- 2 otherwise needed for police investigation."
- 3 SECTION 5. Section 290-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 repealed.
- 5 ["\$290-3 Public auction. If the vehicle is not
- 6 repossessed within the time limits provided in section 290-2,
- 7 the vehicle shall be disposed of by public auction, through oral
- 8 tenders, or by sealed bids, after public advertisement has been
- 9 made once in a newspaper of general circulation; provided that
- 10 the public auction shall not be held less than five days after
- 11 the publication has been made. Where no bid is received, the
- 12 vehicle may be either sold by negotiation, disposed of or sold
- 13 as junk, or donated to any governmental agency."]
- 14 SECTION 6. The department of transportation shall adopt
- 15 rules pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, necessary
- 16 to carry out the purposes of this chapter.
- 17 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 18 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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Report Title:

Abandoned Vehicles; Removal and Disposal; Counties; Public Roads

Description:

Requires the counties to take into custody abandoned vehicles on public roads within ten business days. Specifies that the requirement to provide written notice to the registered owner of an abandoned vehicle under section 290-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, applies only to those abandoned vehicles that have been reported stolen. Amends the conditions that constitute a derelict vehicle under section 290-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes. Repeals section 290-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, requiring the disposal of abandoned vehicles by public auction. (SD1)

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
