A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTAL LICENSURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the majority of
- 2 state dental boards grant licenses to dentists to practice in
- 3 any setting, if those dentists are currently licensed and in
- 4 active, continuous practice for a specified period of time in
- 5 another jurisdiction, without further theoretical and clinical
- 6 examination. This license recognition system for dentists,
- 7 often referred to as licensure by credentials, may also be
- 8 referred to as licensure by reciprocity, endorsement, or
- 9 criteria.
- 10 The legislature further finds that the American Dental
- 11 Association supports licensure by credentials. According to
- 12 American Dental Association policy, "requiring a candidate who
- 13 is seeking licensure in several jurisdictions to demonstrate his
- 14 or her theoretical knowledge and clinical skill on separate
- 15 examinations for each jurisdiction seems unnecessary
- 16 duplication." The American Dental Association also believes
- 17 that "an evaluation of a practicing dentist's theoretical



- 1 knowledge and clinical skill based on his or her performance
- 2 record can provide as much protection to the public as would an
- 3 evaluation based on examination."
- 4 The legislature additionally finds that dental boards in
- 5 forty-six states, plus the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico,
 - 6 have the authority to grant licensure by credentials. Hawaii is
 - 7 one of only four states that do not permit licensure by
 - 8 credentials. This creates difficulties for otherwise well-
 - 9 qualified dentists who seek to relocate to Hawaii. Failure to
- 10 issue licensure by credentials also burdens those dentists with
- 11 roots in Hawaii who went to school on the mainland, as the
- 12 legislature notes that the State lacks a school of dentistry,
- 13 practiced on the mainland for a number of years, but still
- 14 maintain close ties with Hawaii.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase access
- 16 to high-quality dental care in Hawaii, while still maintaining
- 17 appropriate consumer protections, by requiring the board of
- 18 dental examiners to issue a license by credentials to a
- 19 practicing dentist who is licensed in another state and meets
- 20 other specific requirements.

11	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
