A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELEVATOR MECHANICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that elevators are one of
- 2 the safest modes of transportation. There are an estimated
- 3 eighteen billion elevator trips taken per year in the United
- 4 States. With the continued vertical growth of urban Honolulu,
- 5 including some condominium developments that exceed forty
- 6 floors, it is important for Hawaii to ensure that state laws
- 7 governing repair and maintenance of elevators remain current.
- 8 The legislature notes that the elevator mechanics' statute,
- 9 chapter 448H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, has not been updated in
- 10 more than ten years.
- 11 The legislature further finds that, like many other
- 12 sectors, the elevator industry is undergoing rapid technological
- 13 advancements, which require elevator mechanics to expand their
- 14 knowledge and skills through training and education to ensure
- 15 that licensing standards and core competencies are met. Given
- 16 these technological advancements, it is necessary for elevator
- 17 mechanics to demonstrate core competencies when installing,



1 repairing, and maintaining all elevators, escalators, and other 2 vertical transportation. 3 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen regulatory 4 oversight of the licensed profession of elevator mechanics by amending the permissible scope of work, apprenticeship and 5 6 licensing requirements, and remote interaction requirements. 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 448H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by adding five new sections to be appropriately 9 designated and to read as follows: 10 "§448H-A Examination. Every applicant shall pass an 11 examination prescribed by the board for licensure. Every 12 applicant shall: 13 Pass the examination with no less than seventy per (1) 14 cent correct; and 15 (2) Not be allowed to review any of the applicant's failed **16** examinations. **17** §448H-B License renewals; continuing education. (a) 18 Licenses shall expire on June 30 of each even-numbered year.

Licensees seeking renewal shall pay all applicable fees and

complete the continuing education requirements pursuant to

subsection (b).

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1	(d)	Prior to each license renewal, all licensed elevator
2	mechanics	shall complete:
3	(1)	An educational course, approved by the board, of no
4		less than eight hours related to the elevator
5		industry; or
6	(2)	A qualified elevator inspector continuing education
7		course of no less than eight hours offered by a
8		certifying organization accredited by the American
9		National Standards Institute.
10	(C)	An elevator mechanic initially licensed within one
11	year prio	r to the applicable renewal date shall not be required
12	to comple	te the eight hours of continuing education to renew the
13	elevator	mechanic's license.
14	(d)	The board may conduct random audits to determine
15	complianc	e with the continuing education requirement. The board
16	shall pro	vide written notice of an audit to a licensee randomly
17	selected	for audit. Within sixty days of notification, the
18	licensee	shall provide the board with documentation verifying
19	complianc	e with the continuing education requirement established
20	by this s	ection.

1	§448H-C Elevator mechanics; scope of work. All
2	construction; reconstruction; alteration, including flooring;
3	and all elevator cab work, maintenance, repair, troubleshooting,
4	mechanical, or electrical work or adjustments, which includes
5	but is not limited to updating software, changing parameters,
6	resetting faults, and operation of all systems and functions, of
7	any conveyance shall be performed by a licensed elevator
8	mechanic.
9	Work on adjustment of the structure or facility, of which
10	the conveyance may be part or to which the conveyance may be
11	attached, including any construction; reconstruction;
12	alteration, including flooring; and all elevator cab work
13	necessary for proper completion of the work on the conveyance
14	shall be performed by a licensed elevator mechanic.
15	§448H-D Exemptions. Licensure as an elevator mechanic
16	shall not be required for:
17	(1) Dismantling or removing a conveyance; provided that
18	the conveyance is not reused and the building or
19	structure, as defined by its foundation outline, is
20	totally secure from public and unauthorized access and

1		the entire building is being completely demolished
2		down to and including the foundation; and
3	(2)	Employees of a contractor duly licensed under chapter
4		444 who enters into the contract to install, repair,
5		or remove the platform lift or stairway lift within a
6		private residence not accessible to the general public
7		or to other occupants in the building.
8	<u>§448</u>	H-E Remote interaction. Remote interaction of a
9	conveyanc	e shall not be permitted without the express permission
10	of a lice	nsed elevator mechanic who shall be physically present
11	at the co	nveyance; provided that this section shall not preclude
12	remote in	teraction with the conveyance from within the building
13	or comple	x in which the conveyance is located if the interaction
14	is for th	e sole purpose of securing, locking, or providing
15	private u	se of the conveyance."
16	SECT	TION 3. Section 448H-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended a	s follows:
18	1.	By adding two new definitions to be appropriately
19	inserted	and to read:
20	" <u>"Co</u>	nveyance" shall have the same meaning as "elevator and
21	kindred e	equipment" as in section 397-3.

1 "Remote interaction" means an action to manipulate or 2 interact with the controls of a conveyance remotely, or from 3 within the building or complex in which the conveyance is 4 located." 5 2. By amending the definition of "apprentice elevator 6 mechanic" to read: 7 ""Apprentice elevator mechanic" means any person who is [in 8 training to acquire the skill to become an elevator mechanic and 9 who is required to work for at least four years under the 10 supervision of an elevator mechanic duly licensed under section 11 448H-6.] enrolled in an apprenticeship program for the elevator 12 industry that is registered with a state apprenticeship agency 13 recognized by the United States Department of Labor or the 14 Office of Apprenticeship, United States Department of Labor." 15 3. By amending the definition of "elevator mechanic" to **16** read: **17** ""Elevator mechanic" means any person who engages in the 18 construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance, repair, 19 troubleshooting, mechanical, or electrical work or adjustments, 20 which includes but is not limited to updating software, changing 21 parameters, resetting faults, and the operation of all systems

and functions, of any [elevator, dumbwaiter, stage lift, 1 2 mechanized parking garage elevator, escalator, moving walk-or 3 ramp, lift] conveyance, including any construction, reconstruction, alteration, or adjustment of the structure or 4 5 facility of which the same may be a part or to which the same may be attached, necessary for proper completion of the work on 6 the [elevator, dumbwaiter, stage lift, mechanized parking garage 7 8 elevator, escalator, moving walk or ramp, or lift.] conveyance." 9 SECTION 4. Section 448H-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 10 amended to read as follows: 11 "§448H-5 Powers and duties of the board. In addition to any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board shall: 12 13 (1) Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to carry out 14 the purposes of this chapter; Develop, apply, review, and upgrade appropriate 15 (2) techniques, including examinations and investigations 16 17 for determining whether a person meets the requirements of this chapter and standards to insure 18 19 that elevator mechanics will be persons qualified to

serve as such;

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1	(3)	Prescribe, at a minimum, that a nationally recognized
2		examination, augmented with locally developed
3		material, be used in testing for licensure[, the
4		passing grade for the examination to be not less than
5		seventy per cent];
6	(4)	Issue licenses to persons determined, after
7		application of those techniques, to have met the
8		required qualifications and revoke or suspend
9		licenses $[\tau]$ previously issued by the board, pursuant
10		to hearings held in accordance with chapter 91, in any
11		case where the individual holding any license is
12		determined substantially to have failed to conform to
13		the required qualifications, this chapter, or the
14		rules of the board;
15	(5)	Establish and carry out procedures designed to
16		[insure] ensure that persons licensed as elevator
17		mechanics [will], during any period they serve as
18		such, shall comply with the requirements of this

chapter, the rules of the board, and chapter 397 and

rules adopted thereunder;

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1	(6)	Receive, investigate, and take appropriate action with
2		respect to, any charge or complaint filed with the
3		board to the effect that any individual licensed as an
4		elevator mechanic has failed to comply with the
5		requirements of this chapter regarding any complaint
6		regarding job performance by mechanics, the rules of
7		the board, or chapter 397 and the rules adopted
8		thereunder;
9	[-(7)-	Register apprentice elevator mechanics;
10	(8)]	(7) Maintain a record of its proceedings;
11	[-(9)]	(8) Assist and advise the department of labor and
12		industrial relations in the adoption of rules relating
13		to the conditions of work for elevator mechanics,
14		including requirements related to equipment or
15		facilities essential for the safe installation,
16		repair, maintenance, or alteration of any [elevator,
17		dumbwaiter, escalator, moving walk or ramp, and lift;]
18		conveyance; and
19	[(10)]	(9) Notify the department of labor and industrial
20		relations of any fact or situation that, in the

1	opinion of the board, constitutes a violation of
2	chapter 397 or of any rule adopted thereunder."
3	SECTION 5. Section 448H-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§448H-6 Qualifications for license. No person shall be
6	licensed as an elevator mechanic unless the person has
7	satisfactorily passed the examination administered by the board
8	and [satisfactorily completed at least four years of training
9	under the supervision of a licensed elevator mechanic.] has met
10	the following minimum qualifications:
11	(1) Obtained a certificate of completion from an
12	apprenticeship program for the elevator industry that
13	is registered with a state apprenticeship agency
14	recognized by the United States Department of Labor or
15	the Office of Apprenticeship, United States Department
16	of Labor, and is approved by the board using standards
17	similar to but no less stringent than those set forth
18	by the National Elevator Industry Educational Program,
19	and
20	(2) Satisfactorily completed no less than four and one-
21	half years of full-time work or its equivalent, but no

1	less than nine thousand hou	irs, under the direct
2	supervision of an elevator	mechanic duly licensed
3	under this section. The bo	oard, by rule, shall
4	establish the terms for the	e verification of time in
5	the industry."	
6	SECTION 6. Section 448H-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
7	amended to read as follows:	
8	3 "§448H-7 Temporary permit. The	e board may issue a
9	temporary permit to [any] the follow	ing:
10	(1) Any person who has qualific	ed as an elevator mechanic
11	in another state with stan	dards substantially equal to
12	those of this chapter and	who possesses skills or
13	3 training not available in	the State[; provided that
14	the board shall not regist	e r any such person as an
15	5 apprentice elevator mechan	ie]. The board [shall], by
16	[rules and regulations,] r	ule, shall establish the
17	7 terms of the temporary per	mit[-]; and
18	8 (2) An apprentice elevator med	hanic who has a minimum of
19	three years of full-time w	ork experience, but no less
20	than six thousand hours, u	nder the direct supervision
21	of an elevator mechanic du	ly licensed under section

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1	448H-6, if there is a shortage of elevator mechanics
2	in the State. The board, by rule, shall establish the
3	terms for the determination of a shortage of elevator
4	mechanics, the verification of time in the industry,
5	and the terms of the apprentice's temporary permit."
6	SECTION 7. Section 448H-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:
8	"§448H-8 Fees. Application, examination, license,
9	temporary permit, and biennial renewal fees shall be as provided
10	in rules adopted by the director of commerce and consumer
11	affairs pursuant to chapter 91. A fee is required for each
12	reexamination. Application fees are not refundable.
13	[Licenses shall expire on June 30 of each even-numbered
14	year.]"
15	SECTION 8. In codifying the new sections added by section
16	2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
17	appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
18	the new sections in this Act.
19	SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

- 1 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050;
- 2 provided that section 448H-B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as added
- 3 by section 2 of this Act, and section 5 of this Act, shall take
- 4 effect on January 1, 2050.
