A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that principals of public
- 2 schools in the State only have signing authority on purchases
- 3 under \$5,000. This amount has not been adjusted for years and
- 4 the reasoning for the previous cap no longer makes sense as
- 5 inflation has made goods, services, and construction more
- 6 expensive. Allowing principals to enter into contracts to
- 7 purchase goods, services, and construction at a higher amount
- 8 will provide greater efficiency and allow individual schools to
- 9 get the goods, services, and construction in a timely manner.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to allow principals to enter
- 11 into contracts to purchase goods, services, and construction
- 12 valued at less than \$25,000.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "§103D- Department of education; purchasing power of
- 17 school principals. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the



- 1 principal of a department of education school shall have
- 2 authority to enter into contracts for the purchase of goods,
- 3 services, and construction when such goods, services, or
- 4 construction is valued at less than \$25,000; provided that for
- 5 purposes of this section "department of education school" means
- 6 any school that falls within the definition of "public schools",
- 7 as that term is defined in section 302A-101, and is not a
- 8 charter school."
- 9 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
