RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
- 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
- 4 rehabilitation of incarcerated persons.
- 5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 6 public safety for the purposes of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 2. In providing rehabilitation services to
- 8 incarcerated persons under section 1 of this Act, the department
- 9 of public safety may contract with private service providers

- 11 (1) Drug treatment;
- 12 (2) Mentoring;
- 13 (3) Cognitive restructuring;
- 14 (4) Education services:

- 17 (7) Job seeking skills;

5	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
6	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
7	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for
8	electronic monitoring of parolees, pre-trial detainees, and
9	other inmates who may be released into society as a result of
10	rehabilitation services provided pursuant to section 1 of this
11	Act.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	public safety for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 4. The department of public safety shall submit a
15	report no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the
16	regular session of 2019 detailing the department's expenditure
17	plan for the funding appropriated under section 1 of this Act.

Department of Public Safety; Rehabilitation of Incarcerated Persons; Electronic Monitoring; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates \$1,000,000 to the department of public safety for rehabilitation of incarcerated persons. Allows the department to contract with private service providers for rehabilitation services. Appropriates \$250,000 for electronic monitoring of parolees, pre-trial detainees, and other inmates who may be released into society as a result of rehabilitation services provided for under this Act. Requires the department to report to the legislature twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019.
