A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. There is appropriated out of the general
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
4 rehabilitation of incarcerated persons.

5 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
6 public safety for the purposes of this Act.

7 SECTION 2. In providing rehabilitation services to
8 incarcerated persons under section 1 of this Act, the department
9 of public safety may contract with private service providers
10 for:

- 11 (1) Drug treatment;
12 (2) Mentoring;
13 (3) Cognitive restructuring;
14 (4) Education services;
15 (5) Restorative circles;
16 (6) Computer education;
17 (7) Job seeking skills;



- (8) Mental health support;
- (9) Drug testing;
- (10) Counseling; and
- (11) Vocational skill building.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for electronic monitoring of parolees, pre-trial detainees, and other inmates who may be released into society as a result of rehabilitation services provided pursuant to section 1 of this Act.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of public safety for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. The department of public safety shall submit a report no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019 detailing the department's expenditure plan for the funding appropriated under section 1 of this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Report Title:

Department of Public Safety; Rehabilitation of Incarcerated Persons; Electronic Monitoring; Appropriation

Description:

Appropriates \$1,000,000 to the department of public safety for rehabilitation of incarcerated persons. Allows the department to contract with private service providers for rehabilitation services. Appropriates \$250,000 for electronic monitoring of parolees, pre-trial detainees, and other inmates who may be released into society as a result of rehabilitation services provided for under this Act. Requires the department to report to the legislature twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2019.

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
