A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROSTITUTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 712-1209.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "\$712-1209.6 Prostitution; motion to vacate conviction. 4 A person convicted of committing the offense of 5 prostitution under section 712-1200, loitering for the purpose 6 of engaging in or advancing prostitution under section 712-1206, 7 street solicitation of prostitution in designated areas under 8 section 712-1207, or convicted of a lesser offense when 9 originally charged with a violation of section 712-1200, 10 712-1206, or 712-1207, may file a motion to vacate the 11 conviction if the [defendant's participation in the offense was 12 the result of the person having been a victim of: 13 (a) Sex trafficking under section 712-1202 or promoting 14 prostitution under section 712 1203; or 15 (b) A severe form of trafficking in persons as defined in 16 title 22 United States Code section 7102(9)(A). 17 defendant is not subsequently convicted of any offense

1		under the penal code within three years after the date
2		of the original conviction of committing the offense
3		under section 712-1200, 712-1206, or 712-1207 or a
4		lesser offense when originally charged with a

6	[(2)	A motion filed under this section shall:

8	(d)	Be signed and sworn to by the petitioner;
9	(c)	Be made within six years after the date that the
10		person ceases to be a victim as described in
11		subsection (1), subject to reasonable concerns for the
12		safety of the defendant, family members of the
13		defendant, or other victims of the trafficking that
14		may be jeopardized by the bringing of a motion, or for
15		other reasons consistent with the purpose of this
16		section;
17	(d)	Describe all the grounds and evidence for vacation of
18		a conviction which are available to the petitioner and
19	•	of which the petitioner has or by the exercise of
20		reasonable diligence should have knowledge, and
21		provide copies of any official documents showing that

3	(e) Be	subject to the review and written approval of the
4	sta	ate agency or county prosecutor responsible for
5	pre	osecuting the offense that is the subject of the
6	mo f	tion to vacate conviction.
7	(3)] <u>(2)</u>	The court shall hold a hearing on a motion filed
8	under this se	ection [if the motion satisfies the requirements of
9	subsection (2	2); provided that the court may dismiss a motion
10	without a hea	aring if the court finds that the motion fails to
11	assert ground	ds on which relief may be granted.
12	(4) If	the court grants a motion filed under this
13	section, to	review the defendant's record over the three years
14	after the dat	te of the original conviction of committing the
15	offense under	r section 712-1200, 712-1206, or 712-1207 or a
16	lesser offens	se when originally charged with a violation of
17 .	section 712-1	1200, 712-1206, or 712-1207, and if the court finds
18	that the defe	endant has not been convicted of any offense under
19	the penal cod	de within this three year period, the court shall
20	vacate the co	onviction.

1	[(5) A person making a motion to vacate pursuant to this		
2	section has the burden of proof by a preponderance of the		
3	evidence.		
4	(6) This section shall not apply to a motion to vacate a		
5	conviction under this chapter for:		
6	(a) Sex trafficking under section 712-1202;		
7	(b) Promoting prostitution under section 712-1203; or		
8	(c) A person who pays, agrees to pay or offers a fee to		
9	another person to engage in sexual conduct.] "		
10	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that		
11	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were		
12	begun before its effective date.		
13	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
14	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Prostitution; Motion to Vacate

Description:

Allows a defendant convicted of certain prostitution offenses to file a motion to vacate the conviction if the defendant is not subsequently convicted of any offense under the penal code within three years after the date of the original conviction. Repeals certain requirements pertaining to filing a motion to vacate, including the burden of proof, and exclusions of certain convictions of certain prostitution offenses.
