A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

PART I

SECTION 1. The department of business, economic development, and tourism is authorized to establish and fill five full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) state public-private partnership coordinator positions, exempt from chapter 76, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be placed under the director of business, economic development, and tourism to manage certain public-private partnerships entered into by the State and manage certain contracts, proposals, and negotiations associated with the State's public-private partnerships. Public-private partnerships entered into by the Hawaii public housing authority are exempt from this Act.

PART II

SECTION 2. Chapter 201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

"PART . OFFICE OF PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP



1 §201- Office of public-private partnership; established.

2 There is established within the department of business, economic
3 development, and tourism an office of public-private partnership
4 to increase economic development in the State through
5 collaboration between the public and private sectors.

6 §201- Duties. (a) The office of public-private
7 partnership shall:

8 (1) Create a strategic plan that includes:

9 (A) Objectives and goals for the office and criteria
10 to measure the goals;

11 (B) Potential public-private projects that meet the
12 office's objectives and goals;

13 (C) The necessary finances to establish and maintain
14 the office; and

15 (D) The necessary finances to develop, implement, and
16 maintain the potential public-private projects;

17 (2) Coordinate collaboration among state agencies to
18 analyze and develop public-private partnership
19 projects based on the needs and goals of the agency
20 and State, including proposed economic benefits,



1 financial outcomes, contract terms and conditions, and
2 social benefits;

3 (3) Create and maintain an analysis report for each
4 public-private partnership project that shall include:

5 (A) Proposed economic benefits;

6 (B) Potential financial outcomes;

7 (C) Contract terms and conditions; and

8 (D) Social benefits;

9 (4) Develop and analyze plans for future public-private
10 partnership projects, including objectives and
11 criteria to measure the accomplishment of objectives,
12 develop and implement programs through which the
13 objectives are to be attained, and determine financial
14 requirements for public resources based on the needs
15 and goals of the State;

16 (5) Assist those departments having interests in public-
17 private partnerships, coordinate those activities that
18 involve the responsibilities of multiple state
19 agencies, and encourage the timely and effective
20 implementation and completion of project milestones
21 and objectives;



(6) Develop programs to continuously encourage public-private partnership projects that will result in the development of improved infrastructure and government services in Hawaii;

(7) Formulate and assist state agencies in formulating specific program and project proposals to solicit public-private partnerships;

(8) In collaboration with agencies and private businesses, oversee and implement each public-private partnership project; and

(9) Initiate Aloha Stadium redevelopment as its initial public-private partnership project.

(b) The office of public-private partnership shall manage only those public-private partnerships that have a minimum cost of \$."

PART III

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 to:

(1) Establish and fill five full-time equivalent (5.0 FTE) state public-private partnership coordinator positions




pursuant to part I of this Act; provided that the positions may be added to the position count for the department of business, economic development, and tourism; and

(2) Establish and operate the office of public-private partnership.

The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Description:

Authorizes establishment of five state public-private partnership coordinator positions within the department of business, economic development, and tourism to manage certain public-private partnerships entered into by the State and associated contracts, proposals, and negotiations, except public-private partnerships entered into by Hawaii public housing authority. Establishes an office of public-private partnership within the department of business, economic development, and tourism. Appropriates funds.

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
