A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MINORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 ' SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the American
- 2 Psychological Association convened a task force on appropriate
- 3 therapeutic responses to sexual orientation. The task force
- 4 conducted a systematic review of peer-reviewed journal
- 5 literature on sexual orientation change efforts. The task force
- 6 concluded that sexual orientation change efforts can pose
- 7 critical health risks to lesbian, gay, and bisexual individuals,
- including confusion, depression, guilt, helplessness, shame, 8
- social withdrawal, suicide, substance abuse, and other negative 9
- 10 feelings and behaviors.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to protect the physical and
- 12 psychological well-being of minors, including lesbian, gay,
- 13 bisexual, and transgender youth, against exposure to serious
- 14 harms caused by sexual orientation change efforts.
- 15 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by
- 16 adding a new chapter to title 25 to be appropriately designated
- 17 and to read as follows:



1	"CHAPTER
2	SEXUAL ORIENTATION CHANGE
3	§ -1 Sexual orientation change efforts prohibited;
4	advertising prohibited. (a) No person who is licensed to
5	provide professional counseling, including but not limited to a
6	physician specializing in the practice of psychiatry, physician
7	assistant, psychologist, social worker, mental health counselor
8	marriage and family therapist, or a person who performs
9	counseling as part of the person's professional training for any
10	of these professions, shall:
11	(1) Engage in or attempt to engage in sexual orientation
12	change efforts on a person under eighteen years of
13	age; or
14	(2) Advertise the offering of sexual orientation change
15	efforts on a person under eighteen years of age.
16	(b) Any person who is licensed to provide professional
17	counseling who engages in or attempts to engage in the offering
18	of sexual orientation change efforts on a person under eighteen
19	years of age shall be subject to disciplinary action by the
20	appropriate professional licensing authority.

1	(c) For the purposes of this section, "sexual offentation
2	change efforts" means the practice of attempting to change a
3	person's sexual orientation, including but not limited to
4	efforts to change behaviors, gender identity, or gender
5	expressions; or to reduce or eliminate sexual or romantic
6	attractions or feelings toward a person of the same gender.
7	"Sexual orientation change efforts" shall not include
8	counseling for a person seeking to transition from one gender to
9	another or counseling that:
10	(1) Provides acceptance, support, and understanding of a
11	person or facilitates a person's coping, social
12	support, and identity exploration and development,
13	including sexual orientation-neutral interventions to
14	prevent or address unlawful conduct or unsafe sexual
15	practices; and
16	(2) Does not seek to change sexual orientation."
17	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
18	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
19	begun before its effective date.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
