A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RAT LUNGWORM DISEASE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
- 2 health has reported over seventy cases of rat lungworm disease
- 3 caused by Angiostrongylus cantonensis from 2001 to 2014. There
- 4 have been many more cases in 2015, including at least two on
- 5 Maui. The disease has claimed lives and caused crippling
- 6 chronic disability. The cost for one severe case can exceed
- 7 \$1,000,000. The Hawaii island rat lungworm disease working
- 8 group has been formed at the Daniel K. Inouve college of
- 9 pharmacy at the University of Hawaii at Hilo and has been
- 10 conducting research and educational outreach on the disease for
- 11 the past four years.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
- 13 University of Hawaii at Hilo, the department of health, the
- 14 department of land and natural resources, and the department of
- 15 agriculture for programs, studies, and activities related to the
- 16 prevention and eradication of rat lungworm disease.

2	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$695,000 or so much
3	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
4	same sum	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
5	2018-2019	for programs, studies, and activities related to the
6	prevention	n and eradication of rat lungworm disease, including:
7	(1)	Together with the department of land and natural
8		resources and the department of agriculture,
9		implementing a long-term, statewide collaborative
10		effort to monitor invasive mollusk and paratenic hosts
11		for rat lungworm infection;
12	(2)	Conducting laboratory testing to determine the
13		effectiveness of deworming rats to reduce rat lungworm
14		transmission;
15	(3)	Conducting laboratory testing of a wide range of
16		commercially available produce washes as well as other
17		potential solutions;
18	(4)	Conducting laboratory testing of commercially
19		available filters and ultraviolet systems to determine
20		effectiveness in catchment;

1	(5)	Optimizing existing tests or developing new blood-
2		based tests for rat lungworm diagnostics;
3	(6)	Conducting and publishing a study on long-term
4		recovery from rat lungworm disease and recommending
5		medical treatments and assistances;
6	(7)	Together with the department of health, developing a
7		rural health educational outreach program for
8		rainwater catchment users;
9	(8)	Together with the department of health, providing
10		educational outreach to kindergarten through twelfth
11		grade school personnel involved in food procurement
12		and preparation, and school garden projects; and
13	(9)	Developing rat lungworm curriculum and an integrated
14		pest management plan for control of invasive hosts in
15		all Hawaii school garden projects.
16	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
17	of Hawaii	at Hilo for the purposes of this Act.
18	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
20	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
21	same sum	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year

10		providing educational outreach to kindergarten through
11		twelfth grade school personnel involved in food
12		procurement and preparation, and school garden
13		projects; and
14	(4)	Together with the department of agriculture and the
15		department of land and natural resources, develop an
16		integrated pest management plan for best practices for
17		control of rat lungworm hosts and providing that
18		information to the public.
19	The s	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
20	of health	for the purposes of this Act.

2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the

5	2018-2019 for activities relating to the prevention and
6	eradication of rat lungworm disease, including:
7	(1) Together with the department of agriculture and
8	department of health, developing an integrated pest
9	management plan for best practices for control of rat
10	lungworm hosts and providing that information to the
11	public; and
12	(2) Together with the University of Hawaii at Hilo,
13	implementing a long-term, statewide collaborative
14	effort to monitor invasive mollusk and paratenic hosts
15	for rat lungworm infection.
16	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
17	of land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
18	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
19	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and the
21	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
