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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES MEDICAID WAIVER ADMINISTRATIVE CLAIMING SPECIAL FUND.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The department of health developmental

2	disabilities division is the operating agency for the Hawaii's
3	medicaid section 1915(c) home and community based services
4	medicaid waiver for individuals with intellectual and
5	developmental disabilities. The department of health operates
6	the waiver pursuant to a memorandum of understanding with the
7	department of human services, which is the state medicaid agency
8	supervising the administration of the waiver. Therefore, the
9	department of health can claim allowable medicaid federal
10	financial participation for the proper and necessary costs
11	incurred by the department in administering the waiver.
12	Administrative claiming has become increasingly important to
13	defray the rising costs to states for administration of medicaid

programs. To date, the department of health has conducted

which to deposit and from which to draw, federal financial

minimal administrative claiming, and without a special fund in

1 participation for operating the section 1915(c) home and 2 community based services medicaid waiver for individuals with 3 intellectual and developmental disabilities, the department will 4 lack a fund that is necessary to ensure the proper and efficient 5 administration of the waiver and the growing federal 6 requirements for community integration, quality, and 7 accountability. 8 The requirements of operating the waiver are specified in 9 the State's waiver application approved by the federal Centers 10 for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Through the delegated 11 functions, the department must assure the health and welfare of 12 waiver participants, coordinate services, and ensure service 13 quality. Specific requirements for the operating authority 14 include completing initial intake for new waiver applicants, 15 completing annual re-determinations of level of care for 16 continued eligibility, performing fiscal oversight to ensure 17 that waiver enrollment and expenditures are managed against 18 federally-approved limits, implementing person-centered planning 19 processes, developing and monitoring participant individualized 20 service plans, pre-authorizing waiver services, managing

utilization, enrolling qualified providers, monitoring

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- 1 providers, establishing a statewide rate methodology, developing
- 2 policies and procedures for operating the waiver subject to
- 3 department of human services approval, and implementing quality
- 4 assurance and improvement activities for required performance
- 5 measures. The department is contracting to develop a new
- 6 information technology system to assist case managers manage
- 7 information and provide analytics. Many of the activities
- 8 performed by department staff or contracted entities can be
- 9 claimed as administrative costs.
- 10 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to create a special
- 11 fund for administering the section 1915(c) home and community
- 12 based services medicaid waiver for individuals with intellectual
- 13 and developmental disabilities.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 333F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

- 19 There is established in the treasury of the State the
- 20 intellectual and developmental disabilities medicaid waiver

9	funds, which deduction shall be transferred to the general fund
10	of the State and become general realizations of the State. All

12	or disburse any special funds shall cooperate with the director
13	in effecting these transfers. To determine the proper revenue
14	base upon which the central service assessment is to be
15	calculated, the director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter
16	91 for the purpose of suspending or limiting the application of
17	the central service assessment of any fund. No later than
18	twenty days prior to the convening of each regular session of
19	the legislature, the director shall report all central service
20	assessments made during the preceding fiscal year."

- 5 support of individuals with intellectual and developmental
- 6 disabilities.
- 7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 8 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
