# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 351-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) In the event any private citizen is injured or killed
- 4 by any act or omission of any other person coming within the
- 5 criminal jurisdiction of the State after June 6, 1967, or any
- 6 state resident is injured or killed by any act or omission of
- 7 any other person after July 1, 1989, in another state, which act
- 8 or omission is within the description of the crimes enumerated
- 9 in section 351-32, or any resident of this State who is injured
- 10 or killed by an act of terrorism occurring outside the United
- 11 States, as defined in title 18 United States Code section 2331,
- 12 the commission in its discretion, upon an application, may order
- 13 the payment of compensation in accordance with this chapter:
- 14 (1) To or for the benefit of the victim;
- 15 (2) To any person responsible for the maintenance of the
- victim, if that person has suffered pecuniary loss or

1		incurred expenses as a result of the victim s injury
2		or death;
3	(3)	In the case of the death of the victim, to or for the
4		benefit of any one or more of the dependents of the
5		deceased victim;
6	(4)	To any person who has incurred expenses on account of
7		hospital, medical, funeral, and burial expenses as a
8		result of the deceased victim's injury and death; [ex
9	(5)	In cases involving a mass casualty incident, for
10		mental health services to or for the benefit of:
11		(A) A relative of the deceased victim;
12		(B) A witness to the mass casualty; or
13		(C) An individual engaged in business or educational
14		activities at the scene of the mass casualty
15		incident;
16		provided that compensation to a victim shall have
17		priority over compensation to a relative, a witness,
18		or another individual under this paragraph, and
19		provided further that this paragraph shall not apply
20		to a member of a public or private agency responding

1		to or providing services as a result of a mass
2		casualty incident[-];
3	(6)	In the case of the death of the victim, for mental
4		health services to or for the benefit of any one or
5		more of the surviving relatives of the deceased
6		victim; provided that compensation on behalf of the
7		deceased victim shall have priority over compensation
8		to a surviving relative; or
9	(7)	In the case of a crime of abuse of family or household
10		members under section 709-906, for mental health
11		services to or for the benefit of a child witness;
12		provided that compensation to the victim shall have
13		priority over compensation to a witness under this
14		paragraph."
15	SECTION 2. Section 351-33, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
16	amended to read as follows:	
17	"§35	1-33 Award of compensation. The commission may order
18	the paymen	nt of compensation under this part for:
19	(1)	Expenses actually and reasonably incurred during the
20		period of the injury or death of the victim;

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1	(2)	hoss to the victim of carning power as a result of
2		total or partial incapacity;
3	(3)	Pecuniary loss to the dependents of the deceased
4		victim;
5	(4)	Pain and suffering to the victim;
6	(5)	Any other pecuniary loss directly resulting from the
7		injury or death of the victim that the commission
8		determines to be reasonable and proper; [and]
9	(6)	Expenses actually and reasonably incurred for mental
10		health services in the case of a mass casualty
11		incident[+];
12	(7)	Expenses actually and reasonably incurred for mental
13		health services to or for the benefit of any one or
14		more of the surviving relatives in the case of a
15		deceased victim; and
16	(8)	Expenses actually and reasonably incurred for mental
17		health services to or for the benefit of a child
18		witness in the case of a crime of abuse of family or
19		household members under section 709-906."

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
