A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE MASS TRANSIT SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 26-19, Hawaii Revised Statute is amended to read as follows:

 "\$26-19 Department of transportation shall be headed by a single executive to be known as the director of
- 5 transportation. The department shall establish, maintain, and
- 6 operate transportation facilities of the State, including
- 7 highways, airports, harbors, and such other transportation
- 8 facilities and activities as may be authorized by law.
- 9 The department shall plan, develop, promote, and coordinate
- 10 various transportation systems management programs that shall
- 11 include, but not be limited to, alternate work and school hours
- 12 programs, bicycling programs, and ridesharing programs.
- 13 The department shall develop and promote ridesharing
- 14 programs which shall include but not be limited to, carpool and
- 15 vanpool programs, and may assist organizations interested in
- 16 promoting similar programs, arrange for contracts with private
- 17 organizations to manage and operate these programs, and assist

1 in the formulation of ridesharing arrangements. Ridesharing 2 programs include informal arrangements in which two or more 3 persons ride together in a motor vehicle. 4 The department shall adopt and enforce the provisions of 5 the Federal Transit Authority's regulations regarding safety 6 oversight of rail fixed guideway public transportation systems 7 in the State of Hawaii, to protect and promote safety, and 8 welfare, including safety oversight of the aspects of the rail 9 fixed guideway system that are not regulated by the Federal 10 Railroad Administration. 11 The functions and authority heretofore exercised by the 12 department of public works with respect to highways are 13 transferred to the department of transportation established by 14 this chapter. 15 On July 1, 1961, the Hawaii aeronautics commission, the 16 board of harbor commissioners and the highway commission shall 17 be abolished and their remaining functions, duties, and powers shall be transferred to the department of transportation." 18 19 SECTION 2. Section 248-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended to read as follows:

1 "[\$248-2.7] Mass transit special fund; established; 2 distribution of funds. (a) There is established a mass transit 3 special fund to be administered by the department of budget and 4 finance. 5 (b) For the period beginning on January 1, 2018, to 6 December 31, 2030, transient accommodations tax and surcharge on 7 state tax revenues allocated to the mass transit special fund 8 pursuant to sections 237D-2(e) and 248-2.6 shall be deposited 9 into the special fund. The department of transportation shall 10 be credited \$500,000 annually. All interest earned on the 11 moneys in the special fund shall be credited to the general 12 The mass transit special fund shall be exempt from the 13 central service expenses deduction under section 36-27 and 14 departmental administrative expenses deduction under section 36-15 30. 16 Upon receiving a certification statement from the **17** comptroller pursuant to section 40-81.5, the director of finance 18 shall allocate and disburse moneys in the mass transit special 19 fund to the director of finance of a county with a population 20 greater than five hundred thousand; provided that the director 21 of finance shall only disburse those amounts that are certified in the certification statement for that county for the purposes 22

1 specified in section 46-16.8; provided further that revenues 2 allocated from the special fund shall not be used for: 3 (1)Operating or maintenance costs of the mass transit 4 project or any purpose not consistent with section 46-5 16.8(e); or 6 (2) Administrative, operating, marketing, or maintenance 7 costs, including personnel costs, of a rapid 8 transportation authority charged with the 9 responsibility for constructing, operating, or 10 maintaining the mass transit project; 11 provided further that the total amount of funds that are 12 available, allocated, and disbursed by the director of finance 13 pursuant to this section shall not be in excess of the total 14 amount indicated on the certification statement. The director 15 of finance may allocate and disburse moneys pursuant to this 16 section on a monthly basis. 17 Any amounts allocated and disbursed pursuant to this 18 section shall be subject to the availability of funds deposited 19 and on balance in the special fund. The director of finance 20 shall not allocate or disburse any amounts from the special fund 21 that are in excess of any amounts deposited and on balance in 22 the special fund.

1	(d) The director of finance shall post all certification
2	statements received from the comptroller pursuant to section 40-
3	81.5 on the department of budget and finance's website within
4	ten working days of payments made pursuant to this section.
5	(e) The department of budget and finance shall submit an
6	annual report to the legislature not later than twenty days
7	prior to the convening of each regular session on the total
8	amount of funds allocated pursuant to this section.
9	(f) The director of finance may establish rules, exempt
10	from chapter 91, for the purposes of this section."
11	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
