A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PESTICIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the pesticide 2 chlorpyrifos is a concern to the State. Following an assessment 3 of the Pacific northwest and southwest regions, the 4 Environmental Protection Agency issued a revised human health 5 risk assessment in 2014 that showed potential risks to small 6 watersheds with high concentrations of farming where 7 chlorpyrifos may be widely used; Hawaii has yet to be assessed. 8 According to the Environmental Protection Agency, chlorpyrifos 9 can overstimulate the nervous system, causing nausea, dizziness, 10 confusion, and, at very high exposures, respiratory paralysis 11 and death. Extensive scientific studies show exposing children 12 or pregnant women to chlorpyrifos in even small amounts may 13 cause developmental delays, permanently reduced cognitive 14 capacity, behavioral problems, and learning disabilities.

15 The legislature further finds that, recently, a West Kauai 16 agribusiness operation sent at least ten farm workers to the 17 hospital after exposure to chlorpyrifos and that chlorpyrifos



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has been found in the air at Waimea Canyon middle school and in
 the water in the Kekaha ditch, as well as in streams in the
 county of Hawaii.

4 The legislature notes that on December 15, 2017, the 5 California office of environmental health hazard assessment 6 added chlorpyrifos to the list of chemicals known to the state 7 of California to cause reproductive and developmental toxicity, 8 according to experts on California's developmental and 9 reproductive toxicant identification committee. Consequently, 10 beginning on December 15, 2018, all California businesses with 11 ten or more employees will be required to provide a clear and 12 reasonable warning before knowingly exposing anyone to 13 chlorpyrifos above a certain level determined by California's 14 safe drinking water and toxic enforcement act of 1986.

15 The purpose of this Act is to ban the use of pesticides 16 containing the active ingredient chlorpyrifos in the State. 17 SECTION 2. Section 149A-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended to read as follows:

19 "\$149A-31 Prohibited acts. No person shall:

20 (1) Use any pesticide in a manner inconsistent with its
21 label, except that it shall not be unlawful to:



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1	(A)	Apply a pesticide at any dosage, concentration,
2		or frequency less than that specified on the
3		label or labeling; provided that the efficacy of
4		the pesticide is maintained and further provided
5		that, when a pesticide is applied by a commercial
6		applicator, the deviation from the label
7		recommendations must be with the consent of the
8		purchaser of the pesticide application services;
9	(B)	Apply a pesticide against any target pest not
10		specified in the labeling if the application is
11		to a crop, animal, or site specified on the label
12		or labeling; provided that the label or labeling
13		does not specifically prohibit the use on pests
14		other than those listed on the label or labeling;
15	(C)	Employ any method of application not prohibited
16		by the labeling;
17	(D)	Mix a pesticide or pesticides with a fertilizer
18		when [such] <u>the</u> mixture is not prohibited by the
19		label or labeling; or
20	(E)	Use in a manner determined by rule not to be an
21		unlawful act;



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Use, store, transport, or discard any pesticide or 1 (2)pesticide container in any manner [which] that would 2 have unreasonable adverse effects on the environment; 3 4 (3) Use or apply restricted use pesticides unless the 5 person is a certified pesticide applicator or under the direct supervision of a certified pesticide 6 7 applicator with a valid certificate issued pursuant to rules adopted under section 149A-33(1); provided that 8 it shall be prohibited to use or apply a restricted 9 use pesticide for structural pest control uses for a 10 11 fee or trading of services, unless the user or applicator is a pest control operator or is employed 12 by a pest control operator licensed under chapter 13 14 460J; Use or apply pesticides in any manner that has been 15 (4) 16 suspended, canceled, or restricted pursuant to section 149A-32.5; 17 (5) Falsify any record or report required to be made or 18 19 maintained by rules adopted pursuant to this chapter; 20 [or]



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1	(6)	Fill with water, through a hose, pipe, or other		
2		similar transmission system, any tank, implement,		
3		apparatus, or equipment used to disperse pesticides,		
4		unless the tank, implement, apparatus, equipment,		
5		hose, pipe, or other similar transmission system is		
6		equipped with an air gap or a reduced-pressure		
7		principle backflow device meeting the requirements		
8		under section 340E-2 and the rules adopted		
9		thereunder[-]; or		
10	(7)	Use pesticides containing the active ingredient		
11		chlorpyrifos."
