A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOTTOMFISH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the late 1990s,
- 2 the federal government determined that overfishing of certain
- 3 bottomfish was occurring around the main Hawaiian islands.
- 4 To address the problem, the department of land and natural
- 5 resources instituted a system for several bottomfish
- 6 restricted fishing areas and various administrative rules.
- 7 In 2007, the department of land and natural resources reduced
- 8 the number of bottomfish restricted fishing areas but
- 9 increased the area of the remaining twelve bottomfish
- 10 restricted fishing areas.
- 11 The legislature further finds that as a result of the
- 12 federal determination of overfishing of certain bottomfish,
- 13 the department of land and natural resources established a
- 14 coordinated bottomfish management plan with the National
- 15 Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration fisheries. The
- 16 management plan includes peer-reviewed, science-based stock
- 17 assessment that establishes the current annual catch limits,



- 1 which stop all fishing, sale, and possession of certain
- 2 species of bottomfish, referred to as deep 7 bottomfish, for
- 3 each fishing year.
- 4 The legislature further finds that the bottomfish that
- 5 are subject to fishing restrictions under Hawaii law are no
- 6 longer being overfished or subject to other stressors.
- 7 Furthermore, the department of land and natural resources has
- 8 not established a validated scientific basis upon which to
- 9 continue restricting the fishing of bottomfish through the
- 10 bottomfish restricted fishing areas system.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that regulations
- 12 related to bottomfish are supported by the current status of
- 13 stocks and scientific evidence.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 187A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:
- 17 "§187A- Bottomfishing rules. (a) Any rule adopted by
- 18 the department pursuant to section 187A-5 that regulates the
- 19 fishing of bottomfish shall be supported by peer-reviewed,
- 20 scientific evidence and statistics on current status of stocks,
- 21 indicating an environmental necessity for the regulation.

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              Any regulation that does not comply with subsection
         (b)
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    (a) shall be deemed void and unenforceable.
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         (c) In the absence of a rule adopted by the department to
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    restrict the fishing of bottomfish, the federal quidelines
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    regarding annual catch limits of bottomfish shall apply.
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              When a coordinated state and federal management system
         (d)
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    is implemented, the system shall be consistent with the fishery
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    management plan provisions of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery
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    Conservation and Management Act of 1976, as amended.
         (e) As used in this section, the term "bottomfish" refers
