# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 education is one of the largest departments in the State, with 3 two hundred fifty-six schools and forty-two thousand full-time 4 and part-time employees. In addition to the superintendent of 5 education, there is one deputy superintendent, one senior 6 assistant superintendent, and four assistant superintendents, 7 one of whom is the assistant superintendent for information 8 technology services, who oversees six branches and directs a central and field staff of approximately one hundred eighty 9 10 employees. Although the department of education is part of the 11 state executive branch, unlike other executive branch departments, it continues to completely handle its own 12 13 information technology services, including operating its own 14 broadband network, internet services, help desk, email systems, 15 and data center and independently undertaking information 16 technology budget preparation and execution. While large **17** departments like the department of education may always need to

- 1 have its own information technology staff for certain functions,
- 2 especially where intimate knowledge of the educational functions
- 3 and processes of the department is essential, there may be
- 4 significant benefits to working collaboratively within the
- 5 executive branch and more closely with other departments and the
- 6 office of enterprise technology services.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to require the office of
- 8 enterprise technology services, in collaboration with the
- 9 department of education, to establish a working group to study
- 10 the department of education's information technology
- 11 infrastructure, operations, and services.
- 12 SECTION 2. (a) The office of enterprise technology
- 13 services, in collaboration with the department of education,
- 14 shall convene a working group to evaluate the department of
- 15 education's information technology infrastructure, operations,
- 16 and services, including but not limited to:
- 17 (1) Identifying and reviewing duplicative, overlapping, or
- 18 common services and infrastructure provided by the
- department of education and office of enterprise
- 20 technology services;

1	(2)	Recommending which information technology functions
2		are best conducted entirely by the department of
3		education, entirely by the office of enterprise
4		technology services, or in collaboration with the
5		office of enterprise technology services or other
6		departments;
7	(3)	Identifying operational efficiencies and cost savings
8		that may result from such recommendations, as well as
9		enhancements to the educational mission of the
10		department of education and any collaborating
11		departments; and
12	(4)	Refining the working and reporting information
13		technology relationships between the department of
14		education, other executive branch departments, and the
15		office of enterprise technology services.
16	(b)	The working group shall consist of the following
17	members:	
18	(1)	The state chief information officer, or the chief
19		information officer's designee, who shall serve as
20		chair of the working group;

_	(2)	in representative from the office of enterprise and
2		technology services, to be appointed by the governor
3		without regard to the senate confirmation requirement
4		of section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, or the
5		representative's designee;
6	(3)	A representative from Transform Hawaii Government, to
7		be appointed by the governor without regard to the
8		senate confirmation requirement of section 26-34,
9		Hawaii Revised Statutes, or the representative's
10		designee;
11	(4)	The University of Hawaii's chief information officer,
12		or the chief information officer's designee, who shall
13		be an ex-officio non-voting member;
14	(5)	The department of education chief information officer,
15		or the chief information officer's designee, who shall
16		be an ex officio nonvoting member;
17	(6)	The superintendent of education, or the
18		superintendent's designee, who shall be an ex-officio
19		nonvoting member; and

1	(7) The department of education chief academic officer, or
2	the chief academic officer's designee, who shall be ar
3	ex-officio nonvoting member.
4	(c) The working group shall submit a report of its
5	findings and recommendations, including any proposed
6	legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
7	to the convening of the regular session of 2019.
8	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
