A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that behavior analysis
- 2 means the design, implementation, and evaluation of
- 3 instructional and environmental modifications to produce
- 4 socially significant improvements in human behavior. The
- 5 practice of behavior analysis includes the empirical
- 6 identification of functional relations between behavior and
- 7 environmental factors, known as functional assessment and
- 8 analysis, as well as the use of contextual factors, motivating
- 9 operations, antecedent stimuli, positive reinforcement, and
- 10 other consequences to help individuals develop new behaviors,
- 11 increase or decrease existing behaviors, and display behaviors
- 12 under specific environmental conditions.
- 13 Act 199, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, established the
- 14 behavior analyst program within the department of commerce and
- 15 consumer affairs and established licensing requirements for
- 16 behavior analysts. Licensing of behavior analysis services was

- 1 made concurrent with mandated insurance coverage for diagnosis
- 2 and treatment related to autism disorders.
- 3 Act 107, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, temporarily exempted
- 4 some practitioners from licensing requirements of the practice
- 5 of behavior analysis, in particular, direct support workers who
- 6 provide autism treatment services pursuant to an individualized
- 7 education plan.
- 8 Many students enrolled in department of education schools
- 9 would benefit from the expansion of behavior analysis services
- 10 throughout Hawaii's public school system, including but not
- 11 limited to students with autism disorders.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 13 (1) Clarify the licensing exemptions for certain
- 14 individuals under certain conditions who provide
- behavior analysis services; and
- 16 (2) Require the department of education to create and
- implement a plan to provide medicaid billable applied
- 18 behavior analysis services to all students diagnosed
- 19 with autism spectrum disorder within the department.
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 465D-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

15		provided further that the individual does not purport
16		to be a behavior analyst;
17	(2)	An individual licensed in the State who practices
18		psychology and their supervisees including individuals
19		directly supervised by a licensed psychologist, such
20		as: unlicensed master's level practitioners, students,
21		and postdoctoral fellows, who may design behavior

1		analysis services as well as train and supervise a
2		paraprofessional, direct support worker, or parent or
3		guardian in implementing an applied behavioral
4		analysis intervention; provided that the supervision
5		falls within that licensed psychologist's scope of
6		practice; provided that the behavior analysis services
7		provided are within the boundaries of the licensed
8		psychologist's education, training, and competence;
9		provided further that the individual does not purport
10		to be a licensed behavior analyst;
11	[(2)]	(3) An individual who implements or designs applied
12		behavior analysis services and possesses board
13		certification as an assistant behavior analyst from a
14		nationally certifying agency or by the Behavior
15		Analyst Certification Board and who practices in
16		accordance with the most recent supervisory and
17		ethical requirements adopted by the [Behavior Analyst
18		Certification Board] national certifying agency under
19		the direction of a behavior analyst or psychologist
20		licensed in this State;

T	[(5)]	(4) Someone who is working as a classicom teacher and
2		is enrolled in a teacher preparation program working
3		toward licensure, in a school setting who implements
4		and does not design behavior analysis services in
5		direct collaboration with a professional licensed to
6		practice behavior analysis in the State; or a licensed
7		special education teacher who, in a school setting,
8		implements and designs behavior analysis services;
9	<u>(5)</u>	An individual who directly implements [applied] and
10		does not design behavior analysis services and:
11		(A) Is credentialed as a [registered] behavior
12		technician by a nationally recognized
13		organization or the Behavior Analyst
14		Certification Board, and is under the direction
15		of a behavior analyst licensed in this State[+]
16		or a licensed psychologist;

18		who [provides autism treatment services pursuant

21		supervision of a professional licensed in this

16		behavior analysis with nonhuman or nonpatient clients
17		or consumers including but not limited to applied
18		animal behaviorists and practitioners of
19		organizational behavior management;
20	[-(6)]	(9) A matriculated graduate student or postdoctoral
21		fellow whose activities are part of a defined behavior

1		analysis program of study, practicum, or intensive
2		practicum; provided that the student's or fellow's
3		activities or practice is directly supervised by a
4		behavior analyst or psychologist licensed in this
5		State or an instructor from a nationally recognized
6		training organization or in a Behavior Analyst
7		Certification [Board-approved] Board-verified course
8		sequence; or
9	[-(7)]	(10) An individual pursuing experience in behavior
10		analysis consistent with the Behavior Analyst
11		Certification Board's experience requirements;
12		provided that the experience is supervised by a
13		behavior analyst licensed in this State."
14	SECT	ION 3. (a) The department of education shall create
15	an implem	entation plan for the delivery of medicaid billable
16	applied b	ehavior analysis to all students diagnosed with autism
17	spectrum	disorder within the department.
18	(b)	The department of education shall submit an initial
19	report to	the legislature and board of education within ninety
20	days of t	he effective date of this Act; provided that the
21	initial r	eport shall include clear objectives on staffing, data

- 1 collection and analysis, reporting and accountability, and any
- 2 other necessary points to effectuate the implementation plan
- 3 pursuant to subsection (a).
- 4 (c) After the submission of the initial report to the
- 5 legislature and board of education pursuant to subsection (b),
- 6 the department of education shall submit quarterly reports to
- 7 the legislature and board of education; provided that the
- 8 quarterly reports shall include the following:
- 9 (1) The number of students IDEA eligible with autism
- spectrum disorder;
- 11 (2) The number of students requiring applied behavior
- 12 analysis;
- 13 (3) Staffing updates and needs;
- 14 (4) Medicaid reimbursement schedules and amounts;
- 15 (5) Licensure updates; and
- 16 (6) Any other information pertinent to the implementation
- of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.

Report Title:

Practice of Behavior Analysis; Exemptions; Department of Education; Applied Behavior Analysis; Implementation Plan; Reporting

Description:

Clarifies the licensing exemptions for certain individuals under certain conditions who provide behavior analysis services. Requires the Department of Education to create and implement a plan to provide Medicaid billable applied behavior analysis services to all students diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder within the Department. Establishes reporting requirements. (SB2925 HD1)

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
