12	SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respect	ive
13	capital improvement projects set forth in section 1 sh	nall be
14	expended for the purposes of this Act as follows:	
15	(1) The sums appropriated in items 1 through 11	shall be
16	expended by the department of education;	
17	(2) The sums appropriated in item 12 shall be ex	pended by
18	the University of Hawaii system;	
19	(3) The sum appropriated in item 13 shall be exp	ended by
20	the department of defense;	

1	(4) The sum appropriated in item 14 shall be expended by
2	the department of health; and
3	(5) The sums appropriated in item 15 shall be expended by
4	the department of land and natural sources.
5	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
