# A BILL FOR AN ACT

---

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE  
TWENTY-FOURTH SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue  
general obligation bonds in the sum of \$69,620,000 or so much  
thereof as may be necessary, and the same sum or so much thereof  
as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2018-2019  
for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the twenty-  
fourth senatorial district, as follows:

1. Ahuimanu elementary school

SECTION 2. The appropriations made for the capital improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations that are unencumbered as of June 30, 2020, shall lapse as of that date.

SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective capital improvement projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended for the purposes of this Act as follows:

(1) The sums appropriated in items 1 through 11 shall be expended by the department of education;

(2) The sums appropriated in item 12 shall be expended by the University of Hawaii system;

(3) The sum appropriated in item 13 shall be expended by the department of defense;



- 1           (4) The sum appropriated in item 14 shall be expended by  
2           the department of health; and  
3           (5) The sums appropriated in item 15 shall be expended by  
4           the department of land and natural sources.

5           SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.
