A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMINENT DOMAIN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that for the past sixty-
- 2 five years, residents and visitors of Oahu have been free to
- 3 walk along the cement path atop a seawall on or near the seaward
- 4 boundaries of property between 2943 Kalakaua Avenue and 3019
- 5 Kalakaua Avenue to access the beach, shoreline, and ocean for
- 6 swimming, surfing, fishing, and enjoying other activities of
- 7 island living. Over the course of these decades, the State has
- 8 paid for and completed repairs and maintenance on the seawall,
- 9 thereby enabling the public to continue to safely use the
- 10 footpath. As recently as 2006, the legislature appropriated
- 11 funds to repair the seawall. However, the State shortly
- 12 thereafter disclaimed any duty to maintain the seawall, which
- 13 resulted in a lawsuit to require the State to maintain and keep
- 14 the seawall in good and safe condition.
- 15 In Gold Coast Neighborhood Association v. State, 136
- 16 Hawaii 340, 361 P.3d 1243 (App. 2015), the intermediate court of
- 17 appeals affirmed the circuit court's holding that the State had

- 1 acquired an easement over the seawall by common law implied
- 2 dedication and the seawall and real property under the seawall
- 3 by surrender. On certiorari, the supreme court in Gold Coast
- 4 Neighborhood Association v. State, 140 Hawaii 437, 403 P.3d 214
- 5 (2017) affirmed the circuit court and intermediate court of
- 6 appeals decision that the State acquired an easement over and
- 7 across the seawall by virtue of implied dedication, but held
- 8 that the State did not own the seawall or the real property
- 9 underneath it by surrender.
- 10 As a result, the State has interpreted the ruling of the
- 11 case to mean that the State is only responsible for the
- 12 maintaining the top surface of the seawall rather than be
- 13 responsible for the repair and maintenance of the full length
- 14 and depth of the seawall. The Gold Coast Neighborhood
- 15 Association has expressed support for the option of the State
- 16 taking the seawall and the real property underneath the seawall
- 17 through eminent domain in order to provide for the repair and
- 18 maintenance of the seawall and continued public access to the
- 19 beach and shoreline.
- 20 The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1)	Require the department of fand and natural resources
2		to acquire by eminent domain the seawall and the real
3		property underneath the seawall that is located on or
4		near the seaward boundaries of property between 2943
5		Kalakaua Avenue and 3019 Kalakaua Avenue;
6	(2)	Appropriate funds to the department of land and
7		natural resources for the just compensation of taking
8		the seawall and the real property under the seawall;
9		and
10	(3)	Appropriate funds to the department of land and
11		natural resources for the repair and maintenance of
12		the entire seawall and the real property under the
13		seawall.
14	SECT	ION 2. The department of land and natural resources
15	shall acq	uire by eminent domain pursuant to chapter 101, Hawaii
16	Revised Statutes, the seawall and the real property underneath	
17	the seawa	ll that is located on or near the seaward boundaries of
18	property	between 2943 Kalakaua Avenue and 3019 Kalakaua Avenue,
19	for the p	urpose of improving public safety to enable continued
20	aggagg to	the beach ghoreline and egean

1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100 or so much		
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the		
4	just compensation of taking the seawall and the real property		
5	under the seawall that is located on or near the seaward		
6	boundaries of property between 2943 Kalakaua Avenue and 3019		
7	Kalakaua Avenue.		
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
9	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.		
10	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
12	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for		
13	the repair and maintenance of the entire seawall and the real		
14	property under the seawall that is located on or near the		
15	seaward boundaries of property between 2943 Kalakaua Avenue and		
16	3019 Kalakaua Avenue.		
17	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of		
18	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.		
19	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2018.

Eminent Domain; Seawall; Department of Land and Natural Resources; Appropriations

Description:

Requires the department of land and natural resources to acquire by eminent domain the seawall and the real property underneath the seawall that is located on or near the seaward boundaries of property between 2943 Kalakaua Avenue and 3019 Kalakaua Avenue. Appropriates funds to the department of land and natural resources for the just compensation of taking, and the repair and maintenance of the entire seawall and the real property under the seawall.
